ORDINANCE NO. 2021 -01

# AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE OPERATION OF QUALIFIED NON-HIGHWAY VEHICLES ON STREETS UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF THE VILLAGE OF BRIGHTON

WHEREAS, the Village of Brighton has determined that the operation of qualified non-highway vehicles should be allowed under certain conditions on the streets under the jurisdiction of the Village of Brighton; and

WHEREAS, the Illinois Véhicle Code (625 ILCS 5/11-1426.1) authorizes municipalities by ordinance, to permit qualified Non-Highway Vehicles to operate in the streets under the jurisdiction of the municipality; and

WHEREAS the Village of Brighton has considered the volume, speed and character of the traffic on the streets within its jurisdiction and the provisions of 625 ILCS 5/11-1426.1), as well as has determined that qualified Non-Highway vehicles, as defined herein may safely operate on the streets within the jurisdiction of the Village; and

which shall allow the Operation of Non-Highway Vehicles upon the terms and conditions as stated herein.

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF BRIGHTON, MACOUPIN AND JERSEY COUNTIES, ILLINOIS, as follows:

Section 1. Policy Statement. The Village of Brighton, in passing this Ordinance, is not advocating or endorsing the use of non-highway vehicles on Village Streets. Other means of travel may be safer. All persons who operate non-highway vehicles within the Village of Brighton do so at their own risk and peril. In passing this Ordinance, the Village of Brighton does not accept any level of liability for accidents, collisions, injuries or death, or destruction of property. In passing this Ordinance, the Village is merely regulating the use of non-highway vehicles on Village streets, according to the laws of the State of Illinois, in an attempt to increase safety on Village Streets. Non-highway vehicles, specifically defined and qualified herein shall

be allowed on Village Streets, under the conditions as hereinafter stated.

#### Section 2. Definitions.

- A Non-highway vehicle means any motorized off-highway device, designed to travel primarily off-highway, 64 inches or less in width, having a manufacturer's dry weight of2,000 pounds or less, traveling on four (4) or more non-highway tires, designed with a non-straddle seat and a steering wheel for steering control, excepting equipment such as lawnmowers, 3-wheelers, 4-wheelers, go-karts, lawn mowers, and off-highway motorcycles.
- B. Farm Vehicles. This ordinance does not apply to non-highway vehicles engaged in farming operations.
- C. Seat Belts. A set of belts or harnesses meeting the specifications established by the Illinois Department of Transportation and installed in such manner as to prevent or materially reduce the movement of the person using the belts or harness in the event of a collision or the upset of the vehicle.
- D. Village Streets. Any of the streets or roadways under the jurisdiction of the Village of Brighton and within the corporate Village limits. Village streets does not include any street which is under the jurisdiction of a unit of government other than the Village of Brighton.
- E. State roads. Ilfinois Route 267-111.
- F. County Roads. Any county road within the boundaries of the Village limits of Brighton.
- Section 3. Requirements. All persons operating a non-highway vehicle on the Village Streets must comply with the following requirements.
  - A. Must possess a current, valid Illinois Driver's License.
- B. Must possess proof of current liability insurance, a certificate of which shall be kept in/on the non-highway vehicle whenever on Village Streets.
- C. Must obtain a permit from the Village and have the non-highway vehicle certified with the Village of Brighton by inspection by a designated representative.
  - D. Must display a Village decal on both sides of the non-highway vehicle.

#### E. All non-highway vehicles must be equipped with the following:

- (1) Hom.
- (2) Brakes and brake light.
- (3) Front and rear turn signals.
- (4) A steering wheel apparatus.
- (5) Tires.
- (6) Rearview mirror.
- (7) Seat Belts for each passenger.
- (8) Red reflector warning device on the front and rear.
- Yellow flashing light visible for at least 100 feet from the rear of the vehicle.

  Said lights must be turned on when operated one hour before sunrise and One hour before sunset.
- (10) Approved "Slow Moving Vehicle" emblem on the rear of the vehicle (625)ILCS 5/12-709).
- (II) Headlight that emits a white light visible from a distance of five hundred (500) feet to the front which must illuminate when in operation.
- (12) Tail lamp that emits a red light visible from at least one hundred (100) Feet from the rear which must be illuminated when in operation.
- (I3) Any additional requirements which may be added to 625 ILCS 5/1 1-1426.1 of the Illinois Motor Vehicle Code by amendment.

#### F. The operator of a non-highway vehicle shall at all times:

- (1) Obey all traffic laws of the State of Illinois.
- (2) Be eighteen (18) years of age or older.
- Operate his/her non-highway vehicle only on the Village Streets where permitted.
- May not operate said vehicle on streets under the jurisdiction of Brighton Township, Piasa Township, Macoupin County, Jersey County, or the State of Illinois, except to cross said streets, in which case the operator must make a direct crossing in which the crossing is made at an angle of approximately 90 degrees to the direction of the street, road or highway; at a location where no obstruction prevents a quick and safe crossing; the non-highway vehicle is brought to a complete stop before attempting to cross; the operator of the non-highway vehicle yields to the right of way of aH pedestrian and vehicular traffic which constitutes a hazard; and that when crossing a divided highway, the crossing is made only at an intersection of the highway with another public street, road, or highway.
- Operate said vehicle in compliance with the posted speed limit, and regardless, may not exceed thirty (30) miles per hour.
- (6) A person who drives or who is in actual physical control of a non-highway

vehicle on a roadway while under the influence is subject to Section 11-500through 11-502 of the Illinois Vehicle Code (625 ILCS 5/11-500-1 J-502).

- (7) All non-highway vehicles may transport only as many individuals as is the lesser of the number of seats or as its manual cturer designates. No individual may ride on any other portion of the vehicle.
- (8) Children must be restrained in the non-highy ray vehicle in the same manner required as if they were in an automobile. Car seats and seat belt laws and regulations shall be followed when children are in the vehicles.
- (9) The non-highway vehicles headlights and taillights shall be illuminated whenever being operated on Village Street.
- (10) Non-highway vehicles may only be operated on Village Streets from the hours of 6:00 a.m. until 9:00 p.m.
- (11) No person shall drive or be in control of a non-highway vehicle on Village Streets when an analysis of the person's blood, urine, breath or other bodily substance would disclose an alcohol concentration of more than 0.00 grams of alcohol per 100 milliliters of blood or grams of alcohol per 210 liters of breath.
- (12) A person who drives or who is in actual physical control of a non-highway vehicle oh a roadway is subject to the laws of the State of Illinois and Village Ordinances.
- 4. Prohibited Locations. Operation of a non-highway vehicle is prohibited in the following locations:
- 1. Any State roads within the Village corporate limits with the exception of crossing at an approved location.
- 2 Any street, highway or roadway that has a posted speed limit of more than 30 miles per hour.
  - 3. Sidewalks.
  - 4 Walking, running, bike paths.
- 5. Any unpaved area of the Village Parks, with the exception of approved parking at sanctioned events.
- 6 Any private real property within the Village without the written authorization of the owner.

#### 5. Permits.

- 1. No person shall operate a qualified non-highway vehicle without first obtaining a pennit from the Chief of Police or their designee. A copy of said permit shall be kept in/on the non-highway vehicle whenever used on Village Streets. Only an individual with a valid pennit shall be allowed to operate a non-highway vehicle on the streets of the Village of Brighton. Said individual shall only be allowed to operate a non-highway vehicle that has been inspected and approved for travel on Village Streets and feature a Village decal on both sides of the non-highway vehicle. If more than one person will be operating said non-highway vehicle, a permit is needed for each operator.
- 2. Permits shall be granted for a period of one year from the date designated on the permit. Renewal date is annually July 1st, regardless of when the permit was granted.
  - 3. The cost of the permit is Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) per permit.
- 4. Liability Insurance coverage in the amount of not Jess than \$50,000.00 per person, or \$100,000.00 per occurrence and property damage in the amount of \$50,000.00 shall be verified to be in effect by the Brighton Police Department when obtaining and/or renewing a permit.
- 5. Every application for a permit shall be made on a form supplied by the Village and shall contain the following information:
  - (1) Name, address and DOB of the applicant.
  - The serial number, make, mo el, and description of the non-highway vehicle.
  - All applicants shall Release the Village by executing a Sign ed Waiver of Liability releasing the Village and agreeing to defend, indemnify and hold the Village harmless from any and all future claims resulting from the operation of Applicant's non-highway vehicle on Village Streets.
  - Photocopy of applicable liability insurance coverage card specifically for the non-highway vehicle to be operated pursuant to the permit.
  - Such other information as the Village may require.
  - 6 No permit shall be granted unless the following conditions are met:
  - (1) The vehicle must be inspected by the designated representative to insure that the vehicle is safe to be operated on Village Streets and is in compliance with this Ordinance and with the State of Illinois Motor Vehicle Code.
  - 2) The applicant must provide evidence of insurance in compliance with the coverages stated above.
  - A physically handicapped applicant must submit a certificate signed by a physician, certifying that the applicant is able to safely operate a qualified non-highway vehicle on Village Streets.

7. The ViHage may suspend or revoke a pennit granted hereunder upon a finding that the holder thereof has violated any provision of this Ordinance or at anytime there is evidence that the holder cannot safely operate a qualified non-highway vehicle on the designated roadways.

#### 6. Penalties

- 1. Operating a non-highway vehicle on Village Streets is a privilege and not a right. Any person who has a pennit to operate a non-highway vehicle on Village Streets and is found to have violated th.is Ordinance may have his or her pennit suspended or revoked by *an* officer of the Brighton Police Department. Decisions of the said Police Officer shall only be reversed or modified by a majority vote of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Brighton, Illinois.
- 2. Any person found to be operating a non-highway vehicle upon the Village Streets without a permit and/or decal shall be subject to a \$25.00 penalty for the first offense; \$50.00 for the second offense; and \$100.00 for the third offense.
- 3. Anyone found to operate a non-highway vehicle on the Village of Brighton streets, operate said vehicle within the Village in an area where said vehicles are not allowed, or to operate a non-highway vehicle that has not been approved by the Village for travel on Village Streets shall be subject to a \$75.00 fine for the first violation, a \$150.00 fine for a second violation within a 365 day period and a \$500.00 fine for a third violation within a 365 day period. The Village police shall have the authority to bring a complaint against an individual violating this Ordinance to recover the aforementioned fines and to seek an injunction against further violations of this Ordinance. To the extent that any violation of this Ordinance also constitutes a violation of the criminal and/or vehicle statutes of the State of Illinois, then such violator shall also be subject to criminal prosecution.
- 4 Any person in possession of or consuming alcoholic beverages on or in a non-highway vehicle on Village streets, in addition to other penalties which may be available under the laws of the State of Illinois or other provisions of this Ordinance, shall be subjected to revocation of his/her permit to operate a non-highway vehicle on Village streets.
- 5. Any person receiving a citation under this Ordinance shall pay any monetary fine provided for in this section at the police station or the Village Clerk's office within fourteen days from the date of the citation. If any monetary penalty is not paid within said fourt een-day period, the police department is authorized to file a complaint alleging a violation of this ordinance and issue a notice to appear requiring the offender to appear in the appropriate jurisdiction (Jersey County and/or Macoupin County Circuit Court to answer to the charge(s).

#### 7. Miscellaneous

1. Possibility of amendment, suspension, or end of Non-Highway vehicle program.

Individuals are advised that the Village of Brighton is permitting the use of non-highway vehicles on Village Streets in limited circumstances and pursuant to current Illinois law. Individuals should view the use of non-highway vehicles on Village streets as a program which could be suspended, modified, or terminated at any time and effective immediately upon a majority vote of the Village Board of Trustees, repealing this Ordinance, upon a court ruling or in the event of the change in the laws of the State of Illinois or the United States of America. Individuals should consider these factors when making the decision to purchase non-highway vehicles or make potentially expensive upgrades to such vehicles.

- 2. In the event that a court of competent jurisdiction declares any particular provision of this Ordinance to be invalid or unenforceable, the remaining provisions of this Ordinance shall be construed to be valid and enforceable. The invalidity of any part of this Ordinance shall not affect any other part or parts thereof.
- 3. Any Ordinance, or portion thereof, of the Village of Brighton which is contrary to this Ordinance shall be deemed to be repealed.
