Mr. Evans requested a copy of the petition and Attorney Watson said he could have a copy.

Dave Bachman was here as one of the persons concerned about the landfill. It was explained when the Zoning Board met and those people could attend the meeting.

Ron Clark was here about the trailer on Marion Street. Attorney Watson explained the trailer was in no violation as long as it had no utilities and was only used as storage, but he also explained that if the trailer became a health hazard then the city could act on it.

Brtty Price was here to express her appreciation for Robert Wild, Board member whose term had expired, for the time he had given to the city and for the work he had done while in office.
