ORDINANCE NUMBER 97.

AN ORDINANCE making a levy of taxes for corporate purposes for the fiscal year ending on the First day of May, A.D. 1922.

WHEREAS, there was duly passed at a regular meeting of the Village Board of the Village of Brighton, held on the Third day of May, A.D. 1921, an annual appropriation ordinance No. 96, which said ordinance was duly signed and approved on the Third day of May, A.D. 1921, by the President and the Village Clerk of said Village and published in the Brighton News, a weekly secular newspaper of general circulation, published in the said Village, making appropriation for corporate purposes as follows, to-wit:--

THEREFORE, be it ordained by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Brighton, Counties of Macoupin and Jersey, State of Illinois: That there shall be assessed, levied and collected upon all real estate and personal property within the corporate limits of the said Village of Brighton, Illinois, as the same appears from the regularly assessed value thereof, to meet the appropriations for corporate purposes heretofore mentioned, for the fiscal year ending

on the First day of May, A.D. 1922, for the Sum of Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000.00); that the several amounts levied and to be collected for each purpose are as follows:

SECTION TWO.-Any unexpended balances remaining out of any of the aforementioned items may be paid out and expended in making up any deficit existing in any other item or items.

SECTION THREE.- The Village Clerk of the Village of Brighton is hereby directed to make and file with the County Clerk of Macoupin County and also with the County Clerk of Jersey County, immediately upon the passing of this ordinance, a certified copy of this ordinance under the corporate seal of the Village of Brighton, Illinois, for the purpose of causing this levy to be extended on the tax books, as is now required by law.

SECTION FOUR.- This ordinance shall be known as Ordinance No. 97 and shall be in force on and after its passage and approval.



A roll call vote was taken on Ordinance #98 which resulted as follows; I.M. Clark yes, J.J. Kelsey yes, John A. Bauer yes, C.L. Boren yes and A.J. Farrell yes. The ordinance having received a unanimous vote in favor of its adoption it was declared adopted. The Ordinance # 98 is as follows:

ORDINANCE NUMBER 98

BE IT ORDAINED by the President and the Board of Trustees of the Village of Brighton, in the Counties of Macoupin and Jersey and State of Illinois.

Article 1.- There is hereby created the office of Village Inspector of Oils. He shall be appointed by the President of the Board of Trustees, by and with the advise and consent of the Village Board, at the first meeting after the passing of this Ordinance, for the balance of the fiscal year herein and annually thereafter at the May meeting of the Board, who shall hold his office for the term of one year and until his successor is duly appointed and qualified. Said inspector shall receive in lieu of a salary the fees hereinafter fixed.

Said Inspector may appoint one or more deputies who shall be accountable to him for faithful discharge of their duties.

Article 2.- Said Inspector shall, before entering upon the duties of his office, enter into a bond with one or more sureties to be approved by the Village President, conditioned for the faithful discharge of the duties of his office, said bond to be in the penal sum of Five Hundred Dollars.

Article 3.- It shall be the duty of said Inspector to inspect in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance, coal oil, petroleum, naphtha, gasoline, benzine, mineral seal, benzol, signal and other mineral oils and fluids within the Village of Brighton.

Article 4.- Upon the application of any manufacturer, refiner or producer of, or any dealer in any such oil or fluid, or of any officer or person to test any such oil or fluid, such Inspector shall test the same with all reasonable dispatch by applying the fire test, or some other means equally accurate, with which he shall provide himself at his own expense.

If the oils or fluids so tested will not ignite or explode at a temperature less than one hundred and fifty (150) degrees Fahrenheit, the Inspector shall mark, plainly and indelibly, on each cask, barrel or package, "Approved, fire test being"; but if said oils or fluids will ignite at a temperature less than one hundred and fifty (150) degrees Fahrenheit, as aforesaid, then the Inspector shall mark on each cask, barrel or package, "Condemned for illuminating purposes; fire test being".

Article 5.- The Inspector provided for in this Ordinance may charge for his services, not to exceed, at the rate of Ten Cents (10¢) per barrel, and for any quantity less than one barrel, he may charge Ten Cents (10¢) and he shall be paid by the parties requiring his services. The Inspector shall, within twenty-four (24) hours after inspection of oils, heretofore mentioned, return a true and accurate account thereof to the party employing him, and shall make an entry of all oils inspected, in an intelligible manner, in a book prepared for that purpose, which shall be open for inspection to all parties.

Article 6.- No Inspector or Deputy Inspector, while in office, shall manufacture, buy, sell, bargain or otherwise trade, directly or indirectly, in any article which he is appointed to inspect, and for any violation of this article he or they shall be liable to the forfeiture of his or their bond and removal from office.

Article 7.- Any person or corporation who shall violate any of the provisions of this Ordinance, or who shall use or refill any cask, barrel, package, tank or receptacle having the inspector's brand or brands thereon, for the purpose of fraudently evading the conditions of this Ordinance, or who shall mark the Inspector's Device or any mark or marks purporting to be the mark or marks of the Inspector upon any cask, barrel, package, tank or other receptacle of any of the articles named in Article 3 of this Ordinance, or who shall sell or offer for sale within the Village of any of said oils that has not been examined by said Inspector or his deputy, or who shall sell or offer for sale any of said oils out of any cask, barrel, tank, package or other receptacle, which has not been branded or marked by said Inspector in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance, or who shall keep or store within the Village for more than twenty-four (24) hours any of said oils which have not been inspected and branded by said Inspector or his deputy, or who shall sell or offer for sale for illumination purposes any oil which has been condemned for such purpose, shall be fined not less than Twenty-five (\$25.00) Dollars, nor more than One Hundred (\$100) Dollars, for each offence.

AN ORDINANCE providing for the licensing of automobiles in the Village of Brighton and regulating traffic upon the use of the Streets in the Village of Brighton.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF BRIGHTON, THE COUNTIES OF MACOUPIN AND JERSEY, STATE OF ILLINOIS.

SECTION 1. No person who is a resident of the Village of Brighton or who conducts his business within the corporate

limits of said Village, or who does a livery, transfer or taxicab business within said Village of Brighton shall operate his said motor vehicle or vehicles without first obtaining a Village license to be known as the motor Vehicle License; said license shall be due and payable on and after the First of May of each Year. Every person, firm or corporation refusing to procure said license within the month of May or at such subsequent time during the fiscal year as he may acquire or purchase a motor vehicle, shall be considered in default. The license fees herein provided shall be as follows: -

The sum of \$4.00 for each pleasure car or ordinary automobile.

For each motor truck of five thousand (5000) pounds gross weight and less, as now determined under an act regulating motor vehicles in the State of Illinois, shall pay a license fee of \$6.00, and \$10.00 for all trucks in excess of 5000 pounds gross weight.

For all motorcycles a license fee of \$2.00.

Said license fee shall be payable to the Village Clerk, who shall issue a receipt therefor, and furnish the applicant with a metal numbered plate containing the number assigned to said car and the name of the Village stamped thereon, which said plate shall be attached to the front or rear of the motor vehicle in plain sight.

SECTION 2. In parking automobiles upon Main Street Between Center Street and Oak Street, on entire length of Ransom Street: on North Street Between Ransom Street and Main Street, and on Center Street between Ransom Street and Main Street, (all vehicles shall park at an angle with the right rear wheel toward the sidewalk.) and no vehicle shall at any time be parked on a sidewalk, nor across an intersecting street so as to prevent the free passage of pedestrians.

SECTION 3. Any person, firm, corporation or servant or employee thereof, who shall neglect, fail or refuse to comply with the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$200.00 for each and every offense.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after ten days from the time the same is passed, signed and published as required by law, excepting that the provision of this act with reference to the licensing of automobiles shall not be effective until May A.D. 1924.

The Village Clerk of the Village of Brighton is hereby directed to make and file with the County Clerk of Macoupin County and also with the County Clerk of Jersey County, immediately upon the passing of this ordinance, a certified copy of this ordinance under the corporate seal of the Village of Brighton, Illinois, for the purpose of causing this levy to be extended on the tax books, as it is now required by law.

An Ordinance Granting Franchise for the laying of a Drain in
Certain streets in the Village of Brighton.

Be it ordained by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Brighton, in the Counties of Macoupin and Jersey, and State of Illinois.

Section No 1

There shall hereby be granted to B.F. Towse, A.E. Gent and Fred G. Scheffel, Citizens of the Village of Brighton, authority to lay, construct and maintain a certain drain system in said Village beginning at a point at or about the section line between Sections Eighteen (18) and Nineteen (19) on Main Street and extending South along Main Street to an alley between Washington and Brown Streets; thence across said alley to connect with an outlet along the intersection of Cross and Brown Streets,

Section No. 2

During the construction, repair or maintenance operation of said drain, when excavations are made the owners herein shall erect and provide barricades, and shall protect the same during the day time by red flags or other proper warnings and shall display red lights at nite to warn the public.

Section No. 3

The holders of the Franchise herein shall have the exclusive right to maintain said drain to make rules and regulations for connection thereto and to levy and collect such assessments as may be necessary from persons connected with said drain as may be necessary for the maintenance thereof.

Section No 4.

The holders of the Franchise herein their personal and representative capacity shall be liable for any and all damages which may be occasioned to the Village of Brighton by the construction, operation and maintenance of the drain herein and shall save harmless the said Village of Brighton from any and all suits or actions for

for damages which may be occasioned or which may arise by reason of the construction of said drain.

Section No.5

The Franchise herein is granted for the purpose of enabling property owners abutting and adjoining to the drain herein properly to drain their respective premises, and no connection shall be made with said drain without the consent of the holders of the Franchise herein in accordance with the rules and regulations which they may adopt.

This Franchise shall not be assignable nor sold without the express authority first had and obtained from the President and board of Trustees of the Village of Brighton.

Ordinance No. 120

An Ordinance, establishing a fire department for the Village of Brighton.

Section No. 1: There is hereby established a department of the Village Government of the Village of Brighton, in the Counties of Macoupin and Jersey, in the State of Illinois, which shall be known as the Fire Department, and which shall embrace one fire chief, one assistant fire chief and treasurer, and the members of the Brighton Fire Department.

Section No. 2: There is hereby created the office of Fire chief, who shall be appointed annually by the President of the Board of Trustees, and who shall hold his office for a term of one year. Before taking office the said chief shall take the oath similar to that taken by the Village Officers and shall give a Bond in the penal sum of Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars, for the faithful performance of his duty.

Section No. 3 There is hereby created the office of Treasurer of the Brighton Fire Department. Said Treasurer shall be elected by the members of the fire department at a meeting thereof, held on or before the First Day of June A.D. of each year; and he shall hold his office for a term of one year and until his successor is elected and qualified.

The Treasurer shall, before entering upon the duties of his office, take and subscribe to the oath, prescribed by law for the Village of Brighton with sureties to be approved by the President of the Board of Trustees thereof. The penal sum of said bond shall be equal to twice the amount of funds, arising from the fire insurance tax, in the treasury of said department at the time said treasurer takes office, plus twice the aggregate to be received on account fire insurance tax as provided by Ordinance, as estimated for the ensuing year.

Section No.4; It shall be the duty of the Treasurer of the fire department to keep all moneys received on account of fire insurance tax, separate and apart from all other funds in his hands. The proceeds of said fire insurance tax shall be paid out only on warrants signed by the fire chief and Secretary of said department, and ordered by a majority at any vote of those present, at a regular or special meeting of said department. Every such warrant shall state upon its face the purpose for which it is drawn. The said Treasurer shall make an annual report in detail of the receipts and expenditures of the funds arising from said fire insurance tax, which report shall be submitted to the President of the Board of Trustees, on or before the First day of May in each year.

Section No.5; Members of the fire department shall be appointed from time to time by the President of the Board of Trustees, and shall serve for a period of one year or until their successors are appointed.

Section No. 6; This Ordinance take effect from and after its passage and approval.

SECTION ONE: That at a regular Village Election, to be held on Tuesday, April 21st, 1931, there shall be submitted to the qualified voters of said Village the proposition:- Shall serial bonds be issued in the sum of Five Thousand (\$5000.00) Dollars, Two Thousand (\$2000.00) Dollars of which sum shall be in denominations of Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars each, and Three Thousand (\$3000.00) Dollars of which sum shall be in denominations of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars each, bearing interest at the rate of four and one half ($4\frac{1}{2}\%$) per cent, per annum, for the purpose of paying for the right of way secured through the Village of Brighton and in the improvements of the streets along State Highway Number 111.

SECTION TWO. The Village Clerk is hereby directed to cause to be placed upon the official ballots to be voted at such election the proposition as aforesaid and he shall give notice in his election notices, posted as required by law, of the proposition therein submitted.

SECTION THREE. Upon the ratification of this ordinance by a majority of the voters of the Village at said election, the President and Board of Trustees shall be empowered to issue and offer for sale, as is now provided by law, the said several bonds issued under and by authority of this ordinance and the necessary tax for the payment of interest thereon and for the retirement of the principal sum of said bonds when the same shall mature shall be extended, levied and collected in due course of law.

SECTION FOUR. Said bonds shall be numbered serially from One (1) to Thirty-four (34) and shall mature and be paid in the sum of Five Hundred (500.00) Dollars each year, beginning in 1932, until the whole of said series shall been paid, and the interest on the bonds remaining due and unpaid shall be paid annually at the office of the Village Treasurer in the Village of Brighton at the rate of four and one half ($4\frac{1}{2}\%$) per cent per annum.

AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE AND LICENSE THE SALE OF MALT AND VINOUS BEVERAGES.

Be it ordained by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Brighton, in the Counties of Macoupin and Jersey, in the State of Illinois.

SECTION ONE:

No person shall sell malt or vinous beverages either wholesale or retail or shall conduct a malt or vinous beverage business in any stand, place, room, or enclosure within the corporate limits of the Village of Brighton, Illinois, unless he shall have secured a license for same, and paid to Village Treasurer the license fee as hereinafter set forth.

Section Two

A license shall be required of each distributor or seller of malt or vinous beverages, the license fee to be Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) yearly. All license fees shall expire on the first day of May, after the issuance thereof, and shall be paid in advance.

Section Three

Each person desiring a license shall execute a penal bond to the Village of Brighton, with security satisfactory to the village Board, conditioned upon the faithful observance of the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois and of this Ordinance. Such bond shall be in the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1000.00) and shall upon approval be filed with the Village Clerk, who shall thereupon issue a license.

Section Four

Each person license according to the provisions of this ordinance shall immediately post and keep posted, in a conspicuous place on the premises, the license so issued.

SECTION FIVE

No person engaged in the manufacturing, wholesale, distributing or bottling of malt or vinous beverages or any agent of such person or jobber of malt or vinous beverages shall be permitted to receive a license to sell or deliver to any unlicensed consumer or retailer within the incorporated limits of the Village of Brighton, any malt or vinous beverage, nor shall any such person directly or indirectly supply, furnish, give, or pay for any furnishings, fixtures or equipment on the premises or place of business of another licensee authorized under this ordinance to sell at retail malt or vinous beverages nor shall he directly or indirectly be interested in the ownership, conduct, or operation of the business of another licensee authorized to sell at retail malt or vinous beverages. Any licensee who shall permit or assent to being a party in any way to any such violation or infringement of the provisions of this Section shall be deemed guilty of a violation of this Ordinance and subject to the full penalty herein contained.

Section Six

The President of the Board of Trustees may suspend or revoke, for good cause, any license issued under this act.

Section Seven

Whoever violates any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction, be punished by a fine of not less than Five Dollars (\$5.00) and not more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00).

Section Eight:

Any ordinance or parts of ordinances conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed in so far as such conflict exists.

Section Nine:

This ordinance shall immediately become effective after its passage, signing, and publication as required by law.

Ordinance Number 130

An ordinance to regulate the sale of alcoholic liquors.

Be it ordained by the president and board of trustees of the village of Brighton, counties of Macoupin and Jersey, state of Illinois:

SECTION ONE:

It shall be unlawful to sell or offer for sale in the village of Brighton any alcoholic liquors unless the vendor shall first have obtained a retail liquor dealers license as hereinafter provided and unless he shall have complied with the Federal and State regulations for the sale thereof.

SECTION TWO:

Application for such license shall be made to the village President in writing, signed by the applicant and duly verified by oath, and shall contain the following information:-

FIRST:

The name, age and address of the applicant or applicants, and the citizenship of the applicant provided that no application shall be made unless the applicant shall be a bonafied resident of the village of Brighton and shall have been a resident thereof for the period of at least one (1) year proceeding his application.

Second:- Applicant shall state the character of his business; the amount of goods, wares and merchandise on hand at the time ~~of~~ the application is made; correct legal description and location of the premises or place of business; where ~~the~~ it is proposed to operate, and a further statement that the applicant has never been convicted of a felony and is not disqualified by reason of any ordinance or laws of this state.

SECTION THREE:

RESTRICTION ON LICENSE.

No license shall be issued to any who is not a resident of the village nor to one who is not of good character and reputation, nor to one that is not a citizen of the United States.

No license shall be issued to a person who does not own the premises if such a license is sought, or does not have a lease thereon in writing for the full period for which application is made.

No license shall be issued to any law enforcing official; any President or member of the Village Board of trustees, or any President or member of a County board or Supervisor, and no such official shall be interested in any way, directly or indirectly in the sale of alcoholic liquor.

SECTION FOUR:

TERM

Each said license shall terminate on the first day of May next following its issuance. The fee to be paid shall be reduced in proportion to the full calendar months, which have expired in the fiscal year prior to the issuance of the license. The annual fee for a license shall be \$500.00, which shall authorize the retail sale only of alcoholic liquors on the premises described in the application and the license. All fees shall be paid quarterly in advance, and in the event of the revocation or denial of the license, the pro-rata share thereof shall be returned. All fees shall promptly be paid by the President of the Board of Trustees to the Village Treasure.

SECTION FIVE:

CONSUMPTION ON PREMISES.

It shall be unlawful for anyone not having a license to sell or offer for sale any alcoholic liquor for consumption on the premises where sold, or to permit any liquor to be consumed on the premises where sold. Such license shall be displayed in a prominent place on the wall of the room where the liquor is sold and shall authorize the retail sale on the premises specified for alcoholic liquor.

SECTION SIX:

No license shall be transferred by any applicant nor shall there be any property or right of possession in said license except to the person to whom it is issued, it being the intent of this ordinance to consider said license purely a personal privilege and having no right in law other than as a personal license.

SECTION SEVEN:

A retail liquor dealer's license shall permit the sale of alcoholic liquor only on the premises described in the application and the license, and no location may be changed without the express written permit issued by the President of the Board of Trustees.

SECTION NINE:

CLOSING HOURS.

It shall be unlawful to sell or offer for sale any alcoholic liquor in the village between the hours of 11 o'clock at night and 6 o'clock in the morning of every week day, and no liquor shall be sold at any time on Sunday, nor at any time on the day of any National, State, County, Municipal or primary election during the hours when the polls are open.

SECTION TWENTY:

RESIDENCE AREAS.

All that portion of the Village of Brighton embraced within the corporate limits of said Village is hereby declared for the purposes of this Act to be residence area, excepting only that portion of the business area of said Village described as follows: -

That portion of Main Street between Oak Street and the Alton Railroad Company right of way; Center Street extending from Main Street to the corner of Market Street; Ransom Street and North Street from Main Street to Ransom Street.

SECTION TWENTY:

Premises:

No alcoholic liquor shall be sold in any building, nor shall any license be issued for the sale in any building which is used as a residence, nor in any building of any kind in which there are more than two (2) rooms, exceptions only that in a building of more than one (1) story, license may be issued for first floor of said building consisting of not more than two (2) rooms on the first floor and providing that the occupancy of the rooms on the second floor are not owned, operated or leased by the person in possession of the premises on the first floor.

SECTION TWENTY:
VIEW FROM STREET.

In premises upon which the sale of alcoholic liquor for consumption upon the premises licensed, no screen, blind, curtain, partition, article or thing shall be permitted in the windows or upon the doors of such licensed premises nor inside such premises, which shall prevent a clear view into the interior of such licensed premises from the street, road or sidewalk at all times, and no booth screen partition, or other obstruction nor any arrangement of lights or lighting shall be permitted in or about the interior of such premises which shall prevent a full view of the entire interior of such premises from the street, road or sidewalk, and said premises must be so located that there shall be a full view of the entire interior of such premises from the street, road or sidewalk. All rooms where liquor is sold for consumption upon the premises shall be continuously lighted during business hours by natural light or artificial white light so that all parts of the interior of the premises shall be clearly visible. In case the view into any such licensed premises required by the foregoing provisions, shall be wilfully obscured by the licensee or by him or willfully suffered to be obscured or in any manner obstructed, then such license shall be subject to revocation in the manner herein provided.

SECTION TWENTY:

REVOCATION.

The President of the Board of Trustees may revoke any retail liquor dealer's license for any violation of any

provision of this ordinance, or for any violation of any State law pertaining to the sale of alcoholic liquor.

SECTION FOURTEEN

PENALTY

Any person, firm or corporation violating any provisions of this ordinance shall be fined not less than Twenty Five (\$25.00) Dollars nor more than Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars for each offense; and a separate offense shall be deemed committed on each day during or on which a violation occurs or continues.

SECTION FIFTEEN

This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and publication as provided by law.
