He did say that there was a board member serving on the board at the present time that is in conflict since he also services on the Jersey County Board, and requested that the board should act and vote on it at this time. Harold Lewis requested to hold the Fun Run in conjunction with the Brighton Picnic as has been done the past several years. Exact dates of the picnic are not known at this time. Motion was made by Waggoner, seconded by Oertel for the police and street dept. to help with the Run as they have in prior

Years. Voice vote carried unanimously.

Roger Watts asked if the city had a contract with Triax Cablevision. Attorney Watson told him the city has an Ordinance with them and is available upon request.

Walter Ahlemeyer said the Brighton Picnic Association is going to purchase 20 American Flags to be placed on the electric poles for special occasions, the Legion will purchase 5 and he asked if the city would purchase 5. Permission would have to be obtained from Ill. Power to place them on the poles. flags are \$29.85 for 3×5 if purchased through the Legion.
