Public Works report was given by Oertel.

Bob Lowrance seeking information on the 40 acres which he would like to purchase to the North of Seminary Road and Brown Road intersection. Subdivision would border city limits and possibility of annexing into the city limits.

Library report was given by Schoeberle.

Resignation received from librarian Lucia McNear.

Advertise for part time librarian. Virginia Dawdy would like to have more hours if possible.

Discussed removing glass front from the library and put in new windows.

Motion was made by Farmer, seconded by Oertel to accept the library report and resignation. Voice vote carried unanimously.

Police report was given by Waggoner. No meeting was held and a finance committee meeting was held instead. Discussed a utility tax of 2.5% to finance full time dispatching and do away with the wheel tax.

Schoeberle volunteered to contact other communities to see if could find other means of dispatching.

Floyd Lewis stated he did not want anymore taxes.

Schoeberle does not feel taxes should be increased. He volunteered to talk to other Municipalities and see if dispatching could be provided.

Motion was made by Waggoner to draw up an ordinance to impose a 2% Utility Tax on Village residents. Motion died on the floor for the lack of a seconded.

Farmer suggested a cut in the work force of the department and re-scheduling of hours.

Walter Ahlemeyer said that he would like to see the Village work with what money they had before raising taxes. He was told that possibly the fire and ambulance and some other towns may go with us if we had our own dispatching.

Schoeberle suggested a committee be appointed to go to some of the towns to talk to them about dispatching within the next two weeks. Mayor asked Schoeberle, Oertel and Chief Stewart to be on this committee.

Motion was made by Oertel, seconded by Cunningham to accept the police report. Voice vote carried unanimously

#### Sale of Surplus Property
