Old Business - Attorney Watson gave an update on the arbitration which has been resolved in favor or the village. To date the city forfeited Lippold's contract and his bonding company has made no effort to take over the project. Since the arbitration the Lippold firm filed in Circuit Court in Carlinville a petition for a temporary restraining order to prevent the village from terminating the contract. Following a court hearing, the petition was denied. Lippold requested a rehearing by the arbitration service which was denied. Negotiations are under way to complete the job, including substitution of contractors.

Engineer's Report - Wuellner's submitted expenses for this period are \$78,503.53. Motion was made by Stewart, seconded by Little to pay this bill. Roll call vote carried unanimously.
