Brighton, Illinois September 6, 1977

The regular meeting of the Village Board of Brighton was called to order by the president of the board, Walter Ahlemeyer, at 7 o'clock p.m., in the Brightonnmunicipal building on September 6, 1977. The clerk called roll of trustees:

Present: Little, Carr, Birk, Markwardt, Wooldridge, Wild

Minutes of regular meeting of August 1 and special meeting of August 8 were reviewed. Correction: Page 4, regular meeting, should be "ordinance no. 363 needs amended to include all regulatory signs" instead of "stop signs". Motion to accept minutes of two meetings, after correction, was made by Harris Carr, seconded by Don Little.

Jim Anderson of Illinois Bell Telephone, reported on the franchise. Brighton now receives equivalent of \$196.20 per month in franchise. Every 2-years Illinois Bell reviews the franchise. When it is renewed and updated in November, a possible \$32.70 additional increase is expected, Mr. Anderson reported.

Treasurer's Report was given by Luriel Bott as follows:

Property taxes had been received and were broke down as shown on Treasurer's report on page 2. Wooldridge made a motion to accept correspondence as read by Treasurer. Little seconded motion. Voice vote, carried unanimously.

Bids were opened for the snow plow and spreader and read by the clerk as follows:

Bids were given to Bob Birk, Chairman of the truck committee. Committed will study bids and come up with recommendation. tion was made by Ken Markwardt to let truck committee accept bid that meets specifications. Don Little seconded the motion. Voice vote, carried unanimously.

Bob Zoelzer of R. C. Scheffel and Company presented the audit for the Village of Brighton. He stated that the Village's record of general fixed assets should be maintained differently, by putting a \$ value on each item, and the budget should be based more closely to estimated income.

Visitors who wish to be heard: Briarwood Estates residents were present to inquire about house built in Briarwood which they believe to believe to be a modular home. Zoning Board Inspector, Ron Baron, will be contacted to investigate house in question.

Street and Alley Report by George Farmer as follows: 5-days patching, 6-mowing, 1-post office entrance, 4-sidewalks, 2-signs, 2-culverts, 3-ditch cleaning and culverts. Sidewalk on Center Street put in by Illinois Bell Telephone Company has received complaints from first driveway (Kulenkamp) being too high. Clerk is to contact Illinois Bell Telephone that concrete is to be removed by them and we (street department) will fill in with black top. George Farmer will also put black-top on other driveways in that block. Increase tap-on fee from \$225.00 to \$275.00 (for residential) if ordinance is passed. Commercial fees will be determined by the water superintendent based on material and labor costs. Markwardt made a motion that Ordinance no. 392 be passed on first reading. Birk seconded motion. Roll call vote, passed unanimously. Markwardt made a motion to suspend the rules and adopt ordinance on first reading. Little seconded the motion. Roll call vote, passed unanimously.

ordinance no. 393, amending ordinance no. 363, stop sign ordinance, was read by the clerk. Birk made a motion that this ordinance be passed on first reading. Wooldridge seconded motion. Roll call vote, passed unanimously. Birk made a motion to suspend the rules and adopt ordinance on first reading. Carr seconded the motion. Roll call vote, passed unanimaouly.
