The Village Board of Brighton met at 7:00 p.m., January 3, 1978, in the Brighton municipal building. Mayor Walter Ahlemeyer called the meeting to order followed by roll call:

Minutes of regular meeting of December 5 and continued meeting of December 12, 1977, were reviewed. Corrections: Page 1 of regular meeting, last paragraph, misspelled "made". Page 3, last paragraph, misspelled "presented". Page 4, last sentence should read "Orland Rubemeyer should ask for letter of recommendation to a prospective employer which can be given by a board member or president". Bob Wild made a motion that minutes be approved with corrections. Jerome Wooldridge seconded motion. Voice vote, passed unanimously.

Dale Stewart submitted a letter on the changing of Jefferson Street's name. Bob Wild suggested that clerk write him a letter letting him know we have his letter on file for future reference. Cal Vonnahmen submitted a request for permission to sell beer in his rebuilt store. Vote was taken as to proceed with changing of ordinance to cover this:

Roll call vote, passed unanimously. Chief Clark would like to purchase file box for arrest cards and juvenile records. Jerome Wooldridge made motion that he purchase box, Ken Markwardt seconded motion. call vote, passed unanimously. Police Committee recommends that dispatcher be meployed at rate of \$3.00 per hour when Chief Clark is on duty and no one is dispatching. Ken Markwardt made a motion that dispatchers be paid \$3.00 as needed for Clark, handled through Police Committee and policemen's wives be given preference followed by ambulance and fire personnel who have experience. Auxiliary Police would like to spend approximately \$300.00 for snow tires and transmission on car II. wardt made motion that snow tires and transmission be paid to \$300.00 for car II, Jerome Wooldridge seconded motion. vote, passed unanimously. Birk Burton would like compensation for working extra hours during change over from November 26 to December 31 due to emergency. Bob Birk made motion that Burton be paid for hours worked over 88 in each two week period between November 26 and Decmeber 31 for this one time only. Don Little seconded motion. Roll call vote, passed unanimously, Radio frequencies in cars I and II will need to be updated soon since Jersey is changing frequencies. Bob Birk made motion that they proceed with getting frequency change at cost of approximately \$180.00 per car and application be made through West Central Illinois Law Enforcement for reimbursement. Don Little seconded Rodl call vote: motion.

Cal Vonnahmentannounced that it was Brighton-Medora's turn to host 3-M meeting for firement in 3 counties. Ken Markwardt made motion that he proceed with plans and bill to be split between Brighton and Medora. Don Little seconded motion. Roll call vote, passed unanimously. Annual Firemen and Volunteer and Employee appreciation dinner will be held on January 21, 1978.

#### Unfinished Business

Load limit ordinance had been looked into. In order to have ord-inance there would have to be a scale or other way to verify weight. Street and Alley Committee, Markwardt, Carr, Wooldridge and Fammer would meet within the next 30 days with truck drivers on problems of parking.

### New Business

Antirecession fund has money to be spent immediately. Treasurer has typewriter (demonstrator) which can be purchased for \$264.00. Bob Wild made motion that typewriter be bought, Jerome Wooldridge seconded motion. Roll call vote, passed unanimously. Jerome

Wooldridge made motion that George Farmer be paid for 60 hours extra he has worked for snow removal and water breaks. Don Little Roll call vote, passed unanimously. seconded motion.

Bob Birk asked to resign from Police Committee for personal reasons. Resignation was not accepted.

### Problems

Stop sign at Center and Market streets was causing confusion. George was instructed to move fence out and move stop sign up.
