The Village Board of Brighton met at 7 o'clock p.m., April 3,1978, in the Brighton municipal building. The meeting was called to order by Walter Ahlemeyer, Mayor. Clerk called roll of trustees:

Minutes of March 6, 1978, meeting were reviewed. No corrections or deletions were needed. Jerome Wooldridge made a motion that minutes of March meeting be approved, Harris Carr seconded motion.
