Jeanne Bott asked the board to consider limiting Trick or Treat nights to one this year. She stated that she had personally taken a survey of several citizens and the majority favored one night.

Jack Taul of Brighton Khoury League passed on request he had received for a Men's Fast Pitch team to use Brighton ball diamonds as their home field, Watson stated that it could be tentatively worked out with stipulations. Carr moved that Parks Director be authorized to work out agreement which would include agreement for no alcoholic beverages to be allowed. Little seconded motion. Roll call vote approved. Taul was cited for his outstanding service as a volunteer for the Khoury League the past few years.

- 5. Part-time officers have requested pro-rated clothing allowance. This was tabled until \$ figure is brought back with request.
- 6. Request for part-time officer to work for Chief Clark while he attends Officer Joiner's graduation from PTI.
