Ahlemeyer had had many inquiries concerning snowmobiles. Attorney Watson said that Ordinance would have to be passed in order for owners to ride snowmobiles on city streets. Markwardt moved that Attorney check into insurance for snowmobiles to ride in park only and proceed with increasing premium for this privilege if reasonable to be paid out of Revenue Sharing. Wooldridge seconded motion. Roll call vote approved.

Date of January 20 was announced as date set for annual appreciation dinner to be held.

Little moved that date of election be set as April 17, 1979 for 6:00 o'clock A.M. to 6:00 o'clock P.M., Carr seconded motion. Voice vote approved.

Vonnahmen brought up subject of building code for commercial buildings in town. Vonnahmen and Markwardt will servie on committee to take care of future problems and recommendations for possible hiring architect during time of construction of future commercial buildings.

Clerk had been notified that \$25.00 garbage pick up fee was for dumpster only, \$12.50 additional is for pick up of barrels in town area. After discussion it was agreed to keep business area pick up and pay for owed amount.

Motion was made by Wooldridge to adjourn, Little seconded motion.
