The Clerk called the roll and Trustees answering present were Maurice Wilson, Wm. Jones, George Tuey, Belmont Scheffel, Alvin Lucker, and James Hughes.

Absent none.

Minutes of the May, 1965 Board Meeting were read by Clerk.

Motion made by Jones that minutes be approved as read, seconded by Scheffel.

Voice Vote. Carried.

George Tuey was sworn in at this time as a Trustee.

Motion made by Wilson that Merle Bassett be accepted as Village Attorney, seconded by Jones.
