The regular meeting of the Village Board was called to order by President Walter S. Ahlemeyer at 7:00 P.M. in Village Hall. The Clerk called roll of Trustees.

Present: Tuey, Wilson, Jones, Scheffel, Lucker and Hughes.
Absent: None.

The Minutes of Nov. 1st, 1965 were read by Clerk.

The Ordinance #293 which reads, (on all new buildings or construction of old ones, which are in City limits shall be connected with Village sewer where such is available and same connected with Village water,) was accepted.

Ordinance #297 (which reads any individual digging or breaking of surface of streets shall have a permit from Village Board, and for with this permit a deposit of \$50 shall be paid. This deposit shall be held for period of 1 year to determine the adequacy of the repair) This Ordinance was accepted at meeting after change was made.

Motion by Wilson that minutes of meeting be accepted as read, seconded by Scheffel.

A request from tavern operators (Roy Donelson and Jo Marino) was read by Clerk, asking to keep open until 1:00 A.M. This was discussed and tabled until next meeting.

Cliff Abraham was asked to take care of Alvin Schroeder's complaint of needing a culvert to take care of drainage of his ground.

The Municipal Tax collected for July was \$ 768.81. Less 4% \$30.75 for administration, left balance of \$ 738.06

Motor Fuel Tax allotment for October was \$ 809.49

Motion by Hughes to accept correspondence as read and file in proper places, seconded by Jones.

The investigation committee reported that Police should spend more time in Village and less time on Highway, only in emergencies.

There were no grounds for dismissal of Police.

Fire Plugs have been ^{discussed & talked about} put in Sunny Aire and Twin Acres Subdivision. The cost of fire plugs is \$185.00 each.

The rental of Village Hall was discussed and decided to leave the price the same \$5.00.

There being no further business before the house, motion by Scheffel to adjourn, seconded by Tuey.
