Mar. 7, 1966

The regular meeting of the Village Board was called to order by Mayor Ahlemeyer at 7:00 P. M. in Village Hall.

Clerk called roll of trustees:

Present: Tuey, Wilson, Jones, Scheffel, Lucker

Absent: Hughes

Minutes of Feb. 7, 1966 meeting were read. Jones made motion minutes be accepted as read. Tuey seconded.

Voice vote - carried.

Lucker made motion this report be accepted and incorporated in the minutes. Jones seconded.

Jones made motion to accept this report and incorporate in the minutes. Lucker seconded.

Voice vote - carried.

Abraham and Scheffel are to check streets next week.

Scheffel asked that a resolution be passed to appropriate \$6,000 MFT funds to maintain arterial streets this year. Motion made by Scheffel this be passed. Jones seconded.

Voice vote - carried.

Abraham stated he had asked for 28' on Center St. without disturbing sidewalk.

A meeting was held regarding Markwardt complaint of last month. Gene St. Cin to correct this situation.

Cal Vonnehman received Certificate of Accreditation from Illinois Civil Defense Agency for Brighton July 7, 1965 to June 30, 1966.

Cal introduced Bob Schuster, Illinois Bell representative who explained a new system of Emergency Fire reporting, to replace present system:

Basic cost: \$22.00 per mo. for common equipment to handle 10 lines, after that \$2.00 per line extra up to 20 lines, at which time equipment would have to be added at \$5.25.
3 could be on each master station to call all firemen in, cost approx. \$5.65 each.
If warning tone added, \$2.25 plus 30% for each line - total, approx. \$43.10 as against \$30.45 at present, if figured on basis of 10 phones.
1 control station will handle 9 firemen - \$48.75 with 2 master stations.

Cal is to work something out with Fire Dept. and Bell, as all seemed to think this a good set-up.

Adrian Smith reported 6 arrests with \$70.00 in fines. Bob Walkington will be entering armed services soon. Smith was asked to pick up his commission and Clerk instructed to send him letter of thanks for services rendered.

Sewerage was reported overflowing from Mansion House onto Main St. No action taken.

Jones made motion these bills be accepted. Lucker seconded.

Roll call vote - carried.

Correspondence read by clerk. Jones made motion this be accepted and placed in proper file. Tuey seconded.

was read Voice vote - carried.

Complaints from Mrs. Wayne Weiss, 211 Olive, and Cal Vonnehman, North and Ransom, regarding water standing at these locations. Mayor asked Howard Mayberry, to make check, and give recommendations to Scheffel for correction.

Clerk reported one bid only received on mower, this by John Farmer of \$50.00. Scheffel made motion this be accepted. Jones seconded.

Roll call vote - carried.

Mayor announced all railroad crossings will be closed except Main, with \$21,000 worth of flasher type safety equipment installed there.

Attorney made second reading of Ord. #299 regarding vehicle tax. Jones made motion ordinance be accepted. Wilson seconded.

Roll call vote - Carried.

Clerk was instructed to have one publication in Area News.

Wilson & Hughes reported on cost of rest rooms. 2 could be built for \$300 with exception of putting water in and hooking to sewer. Mayberry gave cost of approx. \$90.00 plus extra to hook to sewer. Chase gave figure of approx. \$75.00 to bring water into basement, plus \$150 sewer connection. A committee of Lucker, Wilson & Hughes was appointed to make up specifications and get bids.

Attorney is to send Lloyd Wells a letter regarding a culvert being needed at entrance to his property at east end of Brown Street.

Clerk was instructed to notify Gene St. Cin to repair hole in street on S. Main and to pay \$50.00 which is required according to Ord. #297.

At Tuey's suggestion, attorney is to write Chas. Isringhausen who had purchased property at 117 Palmer, to clean up garbage in front of house.

Wilson mentioned parking in front of Fire Dept. Tuey is to have some "no parking" signs painted.

Tuey was given permission to set post by culvert to keep ends from being crushed.

Wilson, Tuey and Jones were appointed to check into requests for street lights, one by Mrs. Woolsey's trailer near Jones Lumber Yard, and the other at end of Anna St.

No further business appearing before the Board, Tuey made motion to adjourn. Scheffel seconded. Voice vote - carried. - closed 930 PM.
