Chase mentioned that a \$100.00 gift had been presented Mrs. Bob Barber in appreciation of her husband's services during the past several years.

Secretary read a letter from Department of Public Works & Buildings approving resolution for Sec. 5-OS with the understanding that the streets be reshaped to conform with line and grade of proposed gutter, and also that city, prior to advertising for bids, adopt an ordinance establishing diagonal parking only on both sides of MainSt., and parallel parking on one side only of Center St., and send two copies of ordinance to them. Attorney will prepare ordinance.

Regarding flooded basements, Water & Sewer Board met April 27 and found some of the causes of flooding to be waste materials flushed down drains, and new construction with no guttering installed. Engineer will construct a letter for all water and sewer users explaining causes of flooding, and urging correct usage of sewers. A committee of Jones, Wilson and Hughes was appointed to check into this situation and have something concrete for next meeting.

Clerk read copy of letter written by Abraham asking for bids on street that Shakofsky and Village of Brighton is opening in south part of Brighton. This was dropped since Brighton had not called for bids. Shakofsky is to bbide by Subdivision Control Ordinance #292 if he builds any streets.

Regarding R&R Construction Co. lawsuit against Brighton, Ahlemeyer stated he had been served papers that this is now in circuit court. Attorney will work with Abraham and give R&R written summary of what the dispute is about.

A discussion was held regarding amending Ordinance #259 pertaining to cost of water hook-up. Attorney will have ready for next meeting.

Adrian Smith reported 8 arrests - \$50.00 fines. Lucker made motion this report be accepted. Hughes seconded.

Voice vote - carried.

Adrian suggested something be done regarding traffic and parking congestion on North Street between Medical Building and Cal's Market.

The engineer's recommendation on parking will be incorporated in the ordinance regarding parking on Main and Genter Streets.

Chase stated Picnic Association had asked to have their picnic Friday and Saturday, June 24 and 25. Jones made motion permission be granted. Scheffel seconded.

Olerk was instructed to give Larry Snell and Melvin Phelps of Brighton Excavation Co. copies of Ordinance #297, Breaking surface of Public Streets.

Attorney is to write Burlington Railroad regarding cleaning ditches and railroad right-of-way as promised Scheffel some time ago.

Plans were formulated for erecting street signs as follows: Rent hole-digger from Godfrey Work Shop at \$15.00 per day or \$2.00 per hour.

Put posts in with rock,

Wilson to be in general charge, Harold Heideman to cut posts, Tuey and Wilson to be in charge of signs, and each trustee to be in charge of his own part of town when possible. Wilson set May 14 as date to erect signs.

Ahlemeyer stated there was not enough response to have a veterinary

come to Brighton to inoculate dogs.

Attorney will check status of water employees being put on social security. This was tabled from last meeting.

Hughes reported he received one bid only on rest rooms.

Budget & Appropriations Committee met recently and mayor explained the new budget.

He also stated he would put notices in Area News and Telegraph that vehicle taxes are due.

Regarding Firemens' Training Session tabled from last meeting, this

was discussed, but no action taken and decision made to take training freeze according by Attorney will check with other towns and bring ordinance regarding. pinball machines up to date.

Scheffel mentioned that a culvert has to be replaced on Moore St. This was approved.

Citizens State Bank, Jerseyville lots were discussed. \$50.00 to be paid Village before lights and water are connected.

There being no further business to appear before the Board, Lucker made motion to adjourn. Tuey seconded.
