

Brighton, Ill.
July 11, 1966

The regular meeting of the Village Board was called to order by Mayor Ahlemeyer at 7:00 P. M. in Village Hall.

Clerk called roll of trustees:

Present: Wilson, Jones, Scheffel, Lucker, Hughes

Absent: Tuey

Minutes of meeting of June 6 were read. Jones made motion they be accepted. Scheffel seconded. Voice vote - carried.

Minutes of special meeting of June 13 read. Wilson made motion to accept. Scheffel seconded. Voice vote - carried.

Minutes of special meeting of June 15 read. Scheffel made motion to accept. Wilson seconded. Voice vote - carried.

Abraham explained difference in bids on Pre-mix bituminous cold patch material as quoted by Thompson and Mahoney. The difference in mileage from the two plants is 5 miles at 6¢ per mile. This added to Mahoney's bid totalled \$6.05 per ton as compared to Thompson's bid of \$6.00 per ton. Wilson made motion to adopt resolution to change award on the above from Mahoney to Thompson. Scheffel seconded.

Voice vote - carried.

Scheffel seconded. Voice vote - carried.

Lucker made motion to put a grand total of \$5,000 in savings at Piasa First Federal, leaving approximately \$6,000 in bank to date - this would add approximately \$3,000 to the principal. Wilson seconded.

Scheffel made motion report be accepted and incorporated in minutes.

Jones seconded. Voice vote - carried.

Chase reported depositing \$2,000 in Piasa First Federal in 6 month time certificates at 5%.

Regarding construction of building to house water board equipment, Chase has been given a rough estimate of \$5500 for 30' x 40' building. Jones made motion that Water Board obtain bids and have ready at next village board meeting.

Chase also admonished all to conserve water and electricity during the extreme drought.

Adrian Smith reported 8 arrests - \$155.00 fines. Wilson made motion to accept the report. Lucker seconded. Voice vote - carried.

Jones brought up subject of special police. Board members may wear badges and write tickets.

Recruiting agent from Marine Corps and family of George McNear discussed with Board reasons for character references for new recruits.

John Farmer advised that several people want to donate money and labor for building restrooms in village hall if city will furnish materials and pay for sewer connections. Mayor re-activated original committee on rest rooms to work with Farmer.

Hughes also mentioned weeds in vacant lots in Georgine Acres. Complainants are to advise board what lots need mowed.

Correspondence read by clerk. MFT tax allotment - \$876.47. Municipal tax remitted - \$783.99. Wilson made motion to accept correspondence. Scheffel seconded. Voice vote - carried.

A complaint was read from Mrs. Dovie Hubner regarding weeds at the Arthur Barth place. Village tomow, bill sent to estate.

Problems regarding storm sewer tabled until next meeting.

Attorney made second reading of Ordinance #303 regarding tax levy. Wilson made motion to accept. Jones seconded. Roll call vote - carried.

Attorney made second reading of Ordinance #304 regarding mechanical amusement devices. Jones made motion to accept. - Lucker seconded.

Fee - \$10.00 per year each.

Roll call vote - carried.

Attorney made second reading of Ordinance #305 regarding cigarette vending machines. Jones made motion to accept. Lucker seconded.

Fee \$10.00 per year each.

Roll call vote - carried.

Clerk to have Ordinance #303 published in Area News one time and obtain 2 certificates of publication and send, along with copy of ordinance to county clerks in Macoupin & Jersey Counties.

Mayor will have representative at next meeting to explain housing for senior citizens. Lucker made motion to adjourn. Jones seconded. Voice

vote - carried. Adjourned 9:57 P. M.
