

The regular meeting of the Village Board was called to order by Mayor Ahlemeyer at 7:00 P. M. in Village Hall.

Clerk called roll of trustees:

Present: Tuey, Wilson, Scheffel, Hughes

Absent: Jones, Luckner

Minutes of meeting of October 3 were read. Hughes made motion to accept. Wilson seconded. Voice vote - carried.

Abraham stated he has received engineering contract on curb and gutter and a field check will be made November 15. He advised Board to postpone this project until early in season, obtaining bids at regular March meeting.

Abraham also explained transfer of \$60.59 as requested by Division of Highways.

Hughes made motion to accept. Scheffel seconded. Roll call vote - carried.

Clerk to send bill to Cain Lumber Co. for mowing. Also bills to Water Co. for \$41.18 on comprehensive liability policy and \$133.17 for workmens compensation, also for \$105.84 for 1/2 of Fire Dept. Workmens Compensation, to be paid by Retiree from Fire Dept.

Mr. Russell Kanevsky of E.D.A., St. Louis was introduced and explained federal funds available for city buildings.

Bob Jones, Division of Highways attended the meeting in regards to curve at intersection of Main St. and U. S. Route 67. He agreed to install another large warning arrow.

Harold Bruns voiced complaint regarding speeding on West Center. Adrian Smith to work with him on this.

Upon asking for sidewalks on W. Center, Bruns was advised to have easements laid out and furnish labor - Pienie Assn. would furnish concrete.

Bruns offered to do the work if Village would furnish water for an ice-skating rink. Fire Department will pipe water to the rink if a site can be located.

Hughes reported on street south of school. It was decided to make this one way, going west. Meyer to put out notice of this change, and village to install two "one way" signs on one end of street and one at other end.

Committee on Board meetings recommended through busy months to call special meetings, or two per month, balance of year one meeting, raise Mayor's salary to \$300 per year and Trustees to \$10.00 per meeting. Wilson suggested this be tabled for next meeting.

Seneirel reported Bivins of Illinois Power Co. recommended one more light on Avalon St. making three in Sunnyside at cost of \$30.00 and Village will get another free light to ~~replace this~~, later. Approved by voice vote. *to be placed*

One light was recommended at George and Margaret Sts. and one at end of Palmer.

Correspondence read. Wilson made motion to accept. They seconded. Voice vote - carried.

Motor fuel tax allotment \$861.26, Municipal tax, \$793.11.

Regarding dogs - Kenny Noble will not do anything about them unless tied, otherwise a nuisance complaint would have to be signed and filed before a magistrate.

Scheffel mentioned State St. is being taken care of. They mentioned hole on Anna St., and broken culvert.

Jack Bagley has done nothing regarding sewerage in his yard.

Reek has not filed answer to lawyer's counter claim of \$25.00 per day for unfinished work.

Wilson made motion to adjourn. Scheffel seconded. Voice vote - carried. Adjourned 10:15 P. M.
