Dale Musselman, State Civil Defense Agency explained equipment that could be put on police car to be used for warnings of tornadoes, etc., to cover outlying districts that are not reached by present siren. Government will match funds with Civil Defense funds, village to pay and be reimbursed for one-half of the cost. First thing is to get bids, then write letter of intent to State Civil Defense Agency. Tuey made motion we proceed to get bids. Hughes seconded. Voice vote - carried. Verdell Hanner explained Federal Housing - government buildings from architect's viewpoint.
