The regular meeting of the Village Board was called to order by Mayor Ahlemeyer at 7:00 P. M. in Village Hall.

Clerk called roll of trustees:

Minutes of meeting of January 3 were read. Wilson made motion to approve as corrected. Tuey seconded. Voice vote - carried.

Scheffel made motion to accept and incorporate in minutes. Lucker seconded. Voice vote - carried.

Chase asked permission to purchase a gasoline pump, price \$963.00 plus hose \$150.00, total approximately \$1100. Hughes made motion Village pay \$500.00 toward this purchase for emergency equipment. Scheffel seconded. Roll call vote - carried.

Adrian Smith's police report as follows: December fines \$135.00, January fines \$120.00 - 6 arrests in January. Lucker made motion to accept report. Hughes seconded. Voice vote - carried.

Dale Musselman, State Civil Defense Agency explained equipment that could be put on police car to be used for warnings of tornadoes, etc., to cover outlying districts that are not reached by present siren. Government will match funds with Civil Defense funds, village to pay and be reimbursed for one-half of the cost. First thing is to get bids, then write letter of intent to State Civil Defense Agency. Tuey made motion we proceed to get bids. Hughes seconded. Voice vote - carried.

Verdell Hanner explained Federal Housing - government buildings from architect's viewpoint. Four phases are, 1 - advance planning; 2 - feasibility; 3 - plans and drawings; 4 - construction, architectural phase, etc. Hanner will help in first two steps. No action taken.

Alton Emergency Organization has ^{water} chemical 2-wheel trailer at Betsey Ann Fire House, belongs to village. Hughes made motion we receive bids for sale of this item. Tuey seconded. Voice vote - carried.

A request for raise of \$25.00 from Adrian Smith read. Wilson made motion to grant with recommendation that he substitute early hours during heavy traffic, for later ones at least five nights per week, hours to be chosen at random. Lucker seconded. *Smith* Roll call vote - carried.

Lucker made motion to accept correspondence - Hughes seconded. Voice vote - carried.

New date for trial - Feb. 17, 9:30 A. M.

Clerk instructed to write Illinois Power Co. thanking them for prompt action in cleaning up after ice storm, and if possible, trim some trees to prevent recurrence.

Clerk instructed to write Illinois Power Co. asking Mr. Bivins to attend next meeting to discuss our position on lights.

Regarding street south of school, this will be one way going west. Signs to be put up and Ahlemeyer will ask Meyers to instruct children.

Second reading of Ordinance regulating salaries of trustees and mayor. They made motion this ordinance be adopted. Hughes seconded. *Ad #307*

Roll call vote - carried.

Mayberry and Abraham to attend next meeting to discuss culverts.

Lucker made motion to adjourn. Ahlemeyer seconded.

Voice vote - carried.
