Fences have Bob Watson include something on pools that have fences added on the top with steps that fold up.

Discussion was held and it was decided to leave the ordinance as it is. It was found later to be included in section 10-4-9.

We need to add the size of signs for businesses in residential area of 2x2.

In mobile homes 10-4-11 we need to add they need 8x8 storage building for mobile homes.

Also we need to add full concrete pads of 6" in section g.

Also construction should be completed in one year or they need to apply for an extension.

3-2-10 No person shall consume alcoholic beverages on any public street or public parking lots or parks without a permit.

A high-speed Internet service is interested in putting up a tower in town. We will have to have a special meeting to go ahead with this. Schafer stated another company is also interested in doing this. We need to meet with these people to see which would be the best for the village.
