What about the water leak detection? Tim has talked with them they are in Texas working and it will be the middle of April before they will get to us. What about the water valve at Godfrey? They will start Wednesday February 24, 2010. Michael Roberts, Tim Ferguson and Wayne Schafer met with Tom Klasner about the relocation of the waterline on Delhi Rd. to see if they will let us borrow the money for the project for one year since we didn't have the money in this year's budget. Tom Klasner will take to the Jersey County Board to see if they would loan the money to us for the project. Blue prints show about 1,000 feet of waterline from Oak Rest Rd. to Hale Lane will have to be relocated. Sheppard Morgan & Schwaab. Inc. has been awarded the Project Management for the road construction portion project. What about Belvedere and Mobile Streets" Tim said that they have been clearing brush from behind Mobile St. What about the waterline on Rt. 67/111" Tim has talked with Cass Sheppard and they will bid later this spring. Did you get the survey done on South St. Tim said not vet. Have the decals for the water trucks been put on? Tim said they're on order.

New Business: Need to fix the streets they are falling apart North Market, Brown, East City Limits, Seminary, Countryview Lake Drive and Briarwood Lake. Parking lot Schneider Park needs fixed before ball practices begin. Reseed football field and haul dirt to soccer field to build up low areas. The Park committee would like the Public Works Department to find a new area for rock storage. Need to clean up the dirt and concrete pile at Betsey Ann Park. Define parking areas in both parks. The dugout at Schneider Park needs repaired. Corey Gorsich said the drainage on Edwin St. is horrible. We only had a one inch rain and people were out cleaning their own culverts out. Corey didn't like seeing people doing this said we should be keeping up on this. Tim had

pictures of trash cans plugging the culverts along both sides of the streets. Tim will take a look at this and get a list of culverts that need to be jetted and look at drainage issues. Tim will report back on the area with a plan. Eric Benefiel said we need to call IDOT about cleaning out the ditches South of Town. Robert Watson is to send a letter to them about this issue. Tim has been jetting sewer line on W. Oak, Vine and from Wimp's to Palmer Street.

<u>Problems:</u> For next winter, salt storage pad need to be upgraded and expanded. Dead tree needs to come down at the Sewer Plant. Tim said there was a bid on it but he has not seen it.
