H. B. 1007

An Act relating to a curfew for certain children.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

Section 1. (a) It is unlawful for a person less than 18 years of age to be present at or upon any public assembly, building, place, street or highway at the following times unless accompanied and supervised by a parent, legal guardian or other responsible companion at least 21 years of age approved by a parent or legal guardian or unless engaged in a business or occupation which the laws of this State authorize a person less than 18 years of age to perform:

- 1. Between 12:01 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. Saturday;
- 2. Between 12:01 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. Sunday; and
- 3. Between 11:00 p.m. on Sunday to Thursday, inclusive, and 6:00 a.m. on the following day.
- (b) It is unlawful for a parent, legal guardian or other person to knowingly permit a person in his custody or control to violate subparagraph (a) of this Section.
- (c) A person convicted of a violation of any provision of this Section shall be fined not less than \$10 nor more than \$100.

Section 2. County, municipal and other local boards and bodies authorized to adopt local police laws and regulations under the constitution and laws of this State may exercise legislative or regulatory authority over this subject matter by ordinance or resolution incorporating the substance of this Act or increasing the requirements thereof or otherwise not in conflict with this Act.
