Committee report on Police radio: Brighton is mobile station on East Alton Police frequency and radio must be supplied by owner. Operating better now of late. Transistor could operate with Sheriff's offices in Carlinville and Jerseyville.

Anders made motion that President and Village Clerk be authorized to sign the proper forms and resolution requesting a permit to run a 2 inch copper water line across Highway #67 to new filling station south of Montclair Subdivision, seconded by Scheffel.

Letter from Virgil Jones read and discussed. Attorney Kelsey's opinion that C. F. Abraham should check the complaints and then notify R & R Construction Co., if not agreed arbitration would be recourse.

Change Orders 3 and 4 were discussed. Trustee Jones made motion to table the change orders till next meeting, seconded by Ahlemeyer.

Trustee Anders moved that the two dead elm trees at Main and Plum Streets be removed and lowest bid by Loy Witt of Carlinville for the amount of \$122.50 be accepted, he to have Liability Insurance, contract to be drawn by Attorney Kelsey, seconded by St. Cin.

Carroll Marchant explained the gas distribution lines in the village and their hope to have it in by Nov. 15, 1963. Expect to have about 35,000 feet main line.

Motion by Trustee Jones that the house connection for Mrs. Ola Brown and plumbing connection with kitchen and bathroom be called for bids also opened Sept. 10, 1963 at 12:30 P.M., seconded by St. Cin.



Motion by Trustee Anders that the H. Clifft appearing the lowest, the Board approve this bid, seconded by Scheffel.



An Act relating to a curfew for certain children.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
represented in the General Assembly:

Section 1. (a) It is unlawful for a person less than 18 years of age to be present at or upon any public assembly, building, place, street or highway at the following times unless accompanied and supervised by a parent, legal guardian or other responsible companion at least 21 years of age approved by a parent or legal guardian or unless engaged in a business or occupation which the laws of this State authorize a person less than 18 years of age to perform:

1. Between 12:01 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. Saturday;
2. Between 12:01 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. Sunday; and
3. Between 11:00 p.m. on Sunday to Thursday, inclusive, and 6:00 a.m. on the following day.

(b) It is unlawful for a parent, legal guardian or other person to knowingly permit a person in his custody or control to violate subparagraph (a) of this Section.

(c) A person convicted of a violation of any provision of this Section shall be fined not less than \$10 nor more than \$100.

Section 2. County, municipal and other local boards and bodies authorized to adopt local police laws and regulations under the constitution and laws of this State may exercise legislative or regulatory authority over this subject matter by ordinance or resolution incorporating the substance of this Act or increasing the requirements thereof or otherwise not in conflict with this Act.
