Change Orders on Sewer Lines 3 and 4 tabled at last meeting were explained by C. F. Abraham.

Motion by Trustee Anders that Board go on record as approving Change Orders 3 and 4 on sewer lines and authorizing the President and Clerk to sign them, seconded by St. Cin.

Motion by Trustee Jones that firefighting equipment companies be contacted and bids asked on 10 helmets, 10 rain-coats with lining and 10 pair of boots, seconded by St. Cin.

New State Curfew Law H.B. 1007 was read.

Motion by Trustee Ahlemeyer that the Village Board accept the State Curfew Bill 1007, restrictions bearing on persons under 18 years of age, seconded by St. Cin.

Trick and Treat visits were limited by the Village Board until after the Halloween Parade and named three nights, October 28 - 29 - 30 only.

C. F. Abraham presented a new subdivision "Belvedere" to be developed by Theo. Shakofsky, who stated he would have curbs and gutters, would install sewer lines with Engineer to supervise then connect to existing sewer. Discussion of sewer connection charges but no decision was made. He requested culvert and grading and rock for the street to his property.

Motion by Trustee Jones that the Village approve the preliminary plat of Belvedere Subdivision, seconded by Anders.

Motion by Trustee Jones that Park Drive, South Park Drive, Anna Street, Market Street, Highway 111 to Anna Street, Edwin Street, Cindy Street as far as completed or 425 feet be accepted as Village streets, seconded by St. Cin.

Emery Kamp requested authority to rule on complaints in regard to sewerage pools in the Village, the Board granted this.

The Village will get 2 more gas lights in the business district and the two now there are to be moved, one to Cindy Street, the other to the corner of Park Drive and South Park Drive.

Motion by Trustee Jones that Junior Chamber of Commerce be given the authority to cooperate with home owners for the house numbering project, seconded by St. Cin.

Virgil Jones representing the P.T.A. asked if the Village could do something to protect children at railroad crossing on Main Street. 


