ORDINANCE NUMBER 132

AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE THE SALE OF ALCOHOLIC LIQUORS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF BRIGHTON, COUNTIES OF MACOUPIN AND JERSEY, STATE OF ILLINOIS:

SECTION ONE: It shall be unlawful to sell or offer for sale in the Village of Brighton any alcoholic liquors unless the vendor shall first have obtained a retail liquor dealer's license as hereinafter provided, and unless he shall have complied with the Federal and State regulations for the sale thereof.

SECTION TWO: Application for such licenses shall be made to the Village President in writing, signed by the applicant and duly verified by eath, and shall contain the following information:

First: The hame, age and address of the applicant or applicants, and the citizenship of the applicant provided that no application shall be made unless the applicant shall be a bonafide resident of the Village of Brighton and shall have qualified as a legal voter thereof.

Second: Applicant shall state the character of his business; the amount of goods, wares and merchandise on hand at the time of application is made; correct legal description and location of the premises or place of business; where it is proposed to operate, and a further statement that the applicant has never been convicted of a felony and is not discuslified by reason of any ordinance or laws of this state.

SECTION THREE:

RESTRICTION OF LICENSES.

No such license shall be issued to any person who is not a resident of the Village nor to one who is not of good character and reputation, nor to one who is not a citizen of the United States.

No license shall be issued to a person who does not own thepremises if such a license is sought, or does not have a lease thereon in writing for the period for which application is made.

No license shall be issued to any law enforcing official any President or member of the Village Board of Trustees, or any President or member of a County Board or Supervisor, and no such official shall be interested in any way, directly or indirectly, in the sale of alcoholic liquor.

SECTION FOUR:

2/7/39

Each said license shall terminate on the first day of May next following its issuance. The fee to be paid shall be reduced in proportion to the full calender months, which have expired in the fiscal year prior to the issuance of the license. The annual fee for license shall be Three Hundred and Fifty (\$350.00) Dollars, which shall authorize the retail sale only of alcoholic liquors on the premises described in the application and the license.

All the fees shall be paid quarterly in advance, and in the ement of the revocation or denial of the license, the pro-ration share thereof shall be returned. All fees shall promptly be paid by the President of the Board of Trustees to the Village Treasurer.

SECTION FIVE

CONSUMPTION ON PREMISES

It shall be unlawful for anyone not having a license to sell or offer for sale any alcoholic liquor for consumption on the premises where sold, or to permit any liquor to be consumed, on the premises where sold. Such license shall be displayed in a prominent place on the wall of the room where the liquor is sold and shall authorize the retail sale on the premises specified for alcoholic liquor.

SECTION SIX :

No license shall be transferred by any applicant nor shall there be any property or right of possession in said license except to the person to whom it is issued, it being the intent of this ordinance to consider said license purely a personal privilege and having no right in law other than as a personal license.

SECTION SEVEN:

A retail liquor desler's license shall permit the sale of alcoholic liquor only on the premises described in the application and the license, and no location may be changed without the express written permit issued by the President of the Board of Trustees.

SECTION EIGHT:

No license shall be issued for the sale of any alcoholic liquor within one hundred (100) feet of any church or school, nor within one hundred (100) feet of any undertaking establishment.

SECTION NINE: #13

15,1936 CLOSING HOURS

It shall be unlawful to sell or offer for sale any alcoholic liquor in the Village between the hours of 12 o'clock at night and 6 o'clock in the morning of every week day

and no liquor shall be sold at any time on Sunday, nor at any time on the day of any National, State, County, Municipal or primary election during the hours when the polls are open.

SECTION TEN

RESIDENCE AREAS

All that portion of the Village of Brighton embraced within the corporate limits of said Village is hereby declared for the purposes of this Act to be residence area, excepting only that portion of the business area of said Village described as follows: That portion of Main Street between Oak Street and Gillham Street; Center Street extending from Main Street to the West side of Market Street; Ransom Street and North Street extending Two Hundred (200) feet West of Main Street.

SECTION ELEVEN

VIEW FROM STREET

In premises upon which the sale of alcoholic liquor for consumption upon the premises licensed, no screen, blind, curtain, partition, article or thing shall be permitted in the windoww or upon the doors of such licensed premises nor inside such premises, which shall prevent a clear view into the interior of such licensed premises from the street, read or sidewalk at all times, and no booth, screen, partition, or other obstruction nor any arrangement of lights or lighting shall be permitted in or about the interior of such premises from the street, road or sidewalk, and said premises must be so located that there shall be a full view of the entire interior of such premises from the street, road or sidewalk. All rooms where liquor is sold for consumption upon the premises shall be continuously lighted during business hours by natural light or artificial white light so that all parts of the interior of the premises shall be clearly visible. In case the view into any such licensed premises required by the foregoing provisions, shall be wilfully obscured by the licensee or by him wilfully suffered to be obscured in or any manner obstructed, then such license shall be subject to revocation in the manner herein provided.

SECTION TWELVE:

REVOCATION

The President and two Trustees of the Board of Trustees may revoke any retail liquor dealer's license for any violation of any provision of this ordinance, or for any violation of any State law pertaining to the sale of alcoholic liquor.

SECTION THIRTEEN:

Penelty

Any person, firm or corporation violating any provisions of this ordinance shall be fined not less than Twenty Five (25) Dollars nor more than Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars for each offense; and a separate offense shall be deemed committed on each day during or on which a violation occurs or continues.

SECTION POUR THEM:

This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and publication as provided by law.
