ORDINANCE NUMBER 133

AN ORDINANCE making a levy of taxes for corporate purposes for the fiscal year ending the first day of May A. D. 1955.

WHEREAS, there was duly passed at a regular meeting of the Village Board, of the Village of Brighton, held on the first day of May, A. D. 1934, by the President and the Village Board of said Village, and published in the Brighton News, a weekly secular newspaper of general circulation, published in said Village, making appropriation for corporate purposes, as follows, towit:

within the corporate limits of said Village of Brighton, Illinois, as the same appears from the regular Assessed value thereof, to meet the appropriation for corporate purposes heretofore mentioned for the fiscal year ending on the first day of May, A. D. 1935, the sum of Five Thousand \$5000.00 Dollars; that the several accounts levied and to be collected for each purpose are as follows:

Any unexpended balances remaining out of any of the aforementioned items may be paid out and expended in making up any deficit existing in any other items or item.

The Village Clerk of the Village of Brighton is hereby directed to make and file with the County Clerk of Macoupin County, and also with the County Clerk of Jersey County, immediately upon the passing of this Ordinance, a certified copy of this Ordinance under the Corporate Seal of the Village of Brighton, Illinois, for the purpose of causing this levy to be extended on the tax books, as it is now required by law.

This Ordinance shall be known as Ordinance Number 133, and shall be in force from and after its passage and approval.
