ORDINANCE NUMBER 145.

An Ordinance providing for the Licensing of Automobiles in the Village of Brighton and Regulating Traffic upon the Use of Streets in the Village of Brighton.

Be it Ordained by the President and the Board of Trustees of the Village of Brighton, the Counties of Macoupin and Jersey, State of Illinois:

Section One: No person who is a resident of the Village of Brighton or who conducts his business within the corporate limits of said Village, or who does a livery, transfer or taxi-cab business within said Village of Brighton shall operate his said Motor Vehicle or vehicles without first obtaining a Village license to be known as a Motor Vehicle License: said license shall be due and payable on and after the first day of May of each year. Every person, firm or corporation refusing to procure said license within the month of May or at such subsequent time during the fiscal year as he may acquire or purchase a motor vehicle, shall be considered in default. The license fees herein provided shall be as follows:

The sum of Two (\$2.00) Dollars for each pleasure car or ordinary automobile.

The sum of Four (\$4.00) Dollars for truck.

The sum of One (\$1.00) Dollar for motorcycles.

Said license fee shall be payable to the Village Clerk, who shall issue a receipt therefor, and furnish the applicant with a receipt containing the number assigned to said car and the name of the Village stamped thereon, and also a plate or license sticker, which said plate or sticker shall be attached to the windshield or rear glass of the motor vehicle in plain sight.

Section Two: In parking automobiles upon Main Street between Center Street and Oak Street, on North Street between Ransom Street and Main Street, and on Center Street between Ransom Street and Main Street, all vehicles shall park at an angle with the right front wheel at the sidewalk. And no vehicle shall at any time be parked on a sidewalk, nor across and intersecting street so as to prevent the free passage of pedestrians.

Section Three: Stop signs to be known as "Boulevard Stops" may be placed at dangerous corners, crossings or intersections by direction of the Village Board, and any person who shall fail or neglect to heed said stop sign shall be guilty of a Violation of this ordinance, and may be punished for a failure to observe said sign.

Section Four. Any person, firm, corporation or servant of employees thereof, who shall neglect, fail or refuse to comply with the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined not less than Five (\$5.00) Dollars, nor more than Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars for each and every Offense.

Section Five All Ordinances or parts of ordinances, and all resolutions conflicting herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section Six. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after ten days from the time the same is passed, signed and published as required by law.
