ORDINANCE NUMBER 153.

An Ordinance amending Ordinance Number 15 with reference to the creation of the Office of Village Marshall and Providing a Salary therefor.

Be It Ordained by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Brighton, in the Counties of Macoupin and Jersey, in the State of Illinois:

SECTION ONE: That Section Five of Ordinance Number 15 shall be amended so that the same shall hereafter read:

"There shall be created the Office of Village Marshall, who shall receive for special services an annual salary of Geven Hundred Twenty (\$720.00) Dollars payable monthly; and in all village cases before any Justice of the Peace or other Officer for the violation of ordinances be shall receive the same fees as are allowed by law to constables for like services, when costs are collected from the defendant; otherwise his costs shall be in the discretion of the Board of Trustees."

SECTION TWO: "Before entering upon the duties of his office, the Village Marshall shall enter into a bond with the Village of Brighton, in the penal sum of One Thousand (\$1000.00) Dollars, with securities to be approved by the Board of Trustees, conditioned that he will faithfully discharge the duties of his said office and that he will fairly and justly account for and pay over to those legally entitled therto all money that may come into his hands by virtue of his said Office.

SECTION THREE: All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances, and all resolutions conflicting herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

SECTION FOUR: This Ordinance shall be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
