ORDINANCE NUMBER 164.

An Ordinance Making Appropriations For Corporate Purposes For the Village of Brighton for the current fiscal year from the first day of May A. D. 1943, to the first day of May, A. D. 1944.

Be It Ordained by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Brighton, in the Counties of Macoupin and Jersey, in the State of Illinois:

SECTION 1. That the following sums or so much thereof as may be authorized by law, be and the same are hereby appropriated for corporate purposes for the current fiscal year for the Village of Brighton, in the Counties of Macoupin and Jersey, and State of Illinois, the object and purpose of said appropriation being as follows:

For lighting streets -----	\$ 1,000.00
For salaries of village officers -----	1,140.00
For grading streets -----	1,500.00
For building culverts -----	100.00
For purchasing tile -----	100.00
For purchasing lumber -----	100.00
For repairing sidewalks -----	100.00
For laying tile -----	25.00
For building bridges -----	75.00
For stationery -----	25.00
For publishing ordinances -----	25.00
For repairs on fire-engine -----	100.00
For purchasing hose for fire protection purposes -----	200.00
For repairs on other fire apparatus -----	100.00
(The Village of Brighton, Illinois, at an election held in said Village, adopted an Act of the General Assembly of the State of Illinois which permitted the Village of Brighton to levy two (2) mills on the Dollar for fire protection purposes in addition to all other taxes.)	
For printing .....	50.00
For conducting elections -----	75.00
For insurance premiums on firemen -----	50.00
For purchase of fire-engine -----	<u>150.00</u>
 Total -----	 \$ 4915.00

SECTION TWO. All unexpended balances of any item or items of any general appropriation made by this ordinance may be expended in making up any insufficiency in any item or items in the same general appropriation and for the same general purpose or in a like appropriation made by this ordinance.
