ORDINANCE NUMBER 166.

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE LICENSING OF MOTOR VEHICLES CARRYING LOADS WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF BRIGHTON, MACOUPIN AND JERSEY COUNTIES, ILLINOIS; REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 145, and PROVIDING A PENALTY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF BRIGHTON:

SECTION 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation who are residents of the Village of Brighton, Illinois, to use or cause or permit any of his or its agents or employees to use any automobile, motor truck motor bicycle or other motor vehicle in the transportation of persons or property upon the streets, avenues or alleys of the Village of Brighton, Illinois, unless such automobile, motor truck, motor bicycle, or other motor vehicle be licensed as hereinafter provided.

SECTION 2. Any person, firm or corporation desiring a license for any such motor vehicle shall file application with the Village Clerk upon a form or blank provided by him for that purpose, setting forth the name of the applicant and the description of the vehicle for which the license is desired. The applicant shall also pay to the Village Clerk an annual license fee as follows:

Motor Truck -	\$ 4.00
Motor Bicycle -	1.00
Automobile and all other motor vehicles not herein licensed,	2.00

All such licenses shall expire at the end of the fiscal year and when application for license is made after the first quarter of the fiscal year, the license fee shall be the proportionate part of the annual rate fixed by this ordinance. All persons, firms or corporations owning or possessing an automobile, motor truck, motor bicycle or other motor vehicle on the day that this ordinance shall become effective, shall be required to pay the full annual license fee. All revenues derived from such licenses shall be kept as a separate fund and used only for paying the cost and expense of street and alley improvements and repairs.

SECTION 3. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined not less than \$5.00 and not more than \$100.00 for each and every offense, and each day that such vehicle is used upon the streets, avenues or alleys of said Village without having procured a license, as herein provided, shall be considered a separate and distinct offense.

SECTION 4. Nothing in this ordinance shall be construed as requiring persons, firms or corporations not residents of the Village of Brighton, Illinois, to pay the license fee required by this ordinance, but this ordinance shall apply only to persons, firms or corporations who are residents of the Village of Brighton, Illinois.

ORDINANCE 166 (Cont'd.)

SECTION 5. An ordinance heretofore passed by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Brighton, Illinois, and known as Ordinance No. 145 is hereby repealed.

SECTION 6. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, approval and publication.
