That the sum of Three Thousand Three Hundred Fifteen and no/100 Dollars (\$3,315.00), or so much thereof as may be allowed by law, be and the same is hereby levied and assessed on all of the real and personal property within the said Village subject to taxation, according to the valuation of said property as the same is assessed for State and County purposes for the current fiscal year, and appropriation having been heretofore made for all corporate purposes of said Village.
