AN ORDINANCE VACATING THAT PORTION, WITH THE EXCEPTION OF 5 FEET IN THE CENTER, THEREOF, OF STATE STREET, WHICH LIES WEST OF WEST STREET AND EAST OF THE ALTON RAILROAD RIGHT OF WAY AND NORTHEAST OF LOT NUMBERED I IN BLOCK NUMBERED 1 AND SOUTHWEST OF LOT 1 IN BLOCK NUMBERED 2 IN RANDLES'S ADDITION TO THE TOWN, NOW VILLAGE OF BRIGHTON ILLINOIS, ASPER PLAT THEREOF, RECORDED IN THE RECORDER'S OFFICE OF JERSEY COUNTY, ILLINOIS IN BOOK "O", PAGE 635.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF BRIGHTON, ILLINOIS:

WHEREAS, it is determined by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Brighton, that public interest will be subserved by vacating the following portion of State Street in the Village of Brighton:

All that portion, with the exception of 5 feet in the center thereof, of State Street which lies west of West Street and East of the Alton Railroad Right of Way and northeast of Lot numbered 1 in Block Numbered 1 and southwest of Lot Numbered 1 in Block Numbered 2 in Randle's Addition to the town, now Village of Brighton, Illinois asper Plat thereof, recorded in the Recorder's Office of Jersey County, Illinois in Book "O", Page 635.

WHEREAS, ANTON MAYERHOFFER AND GOLDIE J. MAYERHOFFER, HIS wife, and FRANK T. CARR A ND FLORENCE B. CARR, his wife, are now the owners of all the real estate on both sides of that portion of said street described as aforesaid; and

WHEREAS, in the Judgement of the President and Board of Trustees of the said Village of Brighton, Illinois, it is deemed that compensation in the amount of Forty and no/100 (\$40.00) Dollars, is equal to the benefits which will accrue to the owners of property abutting on said portion of State Street by reason of such vacation: and

WHEREAS, the said ANTON MAYERHOFFER and GOLDIE J. MAYERHOFFER, his wife, and FRANK T. CARR and FLORENCE B. CARR, his wife, have tendered and deposited with the Village Treasurer of the Village of Brighton, the sum of Forty and no/100 (\$40.00) Dollars, in payment for all the benefits that will accrue to abutting property owners by reason of such vacation;

NO, THEREFORE:

Section 1. The following portion of State Street in the Village of Brighton is hereby declared vacated and no longer a part of State Street:

All that portion, with the exception of 5 feet in the center thereof, of State Street which lies west of West Street and east of the Alton Railroad Right of Way and northeast of Lot Numbered 1 in Block Numbered 2 in Randles' Addition to the Town, now Village of Brighton, Illinois, as per Plat thereof, recorded in the Recorder's Office of Jersey County, Illinois, in Book "O", Page 635.

Section 2. The tender of Forty and no/100 (\$40.00) Dollars by said ANTON MAYERHOFFER AND GOLDIE J. MAYERHOFFER, his wife, and FRANK T. CARR and FLORENCE B. CARR, his wife, is hereby accepted by the Village of Brighton, as full payment of compensation for all the benefits which will accrue to abutting property owners by reason of this vacation.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall be known as Ordinance Number 178 and shall be in full force and affect from and after its passage and approval.
