AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE PURCHASE OF LOT NO. 13 OF HERMES' ADDITION TO THE VILLAGE OF BRIGHTON, ILL.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF BRIGHTON, ILLINOIS:

WHEREAS, it is determined by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Brighton, Illinois, that public interest will be subserved by extending Jersey Street in said Village in a Southeasterly direction over Lot No. 13 of Hermes' Addition to the Village of Brighton, Illinois, so that it will connect with State Highway No. 111;

and

WHEREAS, Alva F. Wiseman and Ida B. Wiseman, his wife, are now the owners in joint tenancy of all of said Lot No. 13; and

WHEREAS, in the judgement of the President and Board of Trustees of said Village of Brighton, Illinois, it is deemed that the fair market value of said Lot No. 13 is Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00), and that that amount is equivalent to the benefits which will accrue to the Village by having Jersey Street extended over it to connect with State Highway No. 111; and

WHEREAS, the said Alva F. Wiseman and Ida B. Wiseman, his wife, are willing to sell and convey by quit-claim deed said Lot No. 13 to the Village of Brighton, Illinois, for the said sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00), and whereas the President and Board of Trustees of said Village of Brighton, Illinois, feel that the purchase of said Lot No. 13 is for the best interest of the Village of Brighton;

NOW THEREFORE:

Section 1. That Lot No. 13 in Hermes' Addition to the Village of Brighton, Illinois, be purchased by the Village of Brighton, Illinois, so that Jersey Street in said Village may be extended in a Southeasterly direction over it and connect with State Highway No. 111.

Section 2. That said Village of Brighton pay to Alva F. Wiseman and Ida B. Wiseman, his wife, the sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) as full compensation for said Lot No. 13, upon receipt from them of a quit-claim deed conveying said Lot No. 13 to the Village of Brighton, ILL.
