Said Ordinance covering its operation was read and found to be obsolete to the conditions of the present time.

Yancey moved and Kuehnel seconded the motion to have the Village Attorney to draw up a new Ordinance covering the Licensing of 'Pool Tables' at the rate of \$5.00 per table per year and \$12.00 per year on 'Pin Ball Machines'. Motion carried

The Clerk was also instructed to inform the Village Attorney to write to Mr. B. V. Bodie, Supt. of G. M. & O. R. R. Bloomington, Ill., pertaining to the blocking of the railroad crossing in the Village.

A general discussion on limitations and restrictions was held, and Ziegenbein moved and Kuehnel seconded the motion to lease the Village Hall to Rolland Yost ~~for the following four months, rent in advance, with an option on the same following month at \$15.00 per month~~ with the following restrictions:

- a--Closed on all election days, until after votes are counted.
- b--Room to be provided in front of hall for booths and tables on election days.
- c--All of stage and Library room reserved.
- d--Tenant to furnish own heat and light.
- e--Cooking to be done only in North-West room, north of stage.
- f--Time of Lease: Four Months, option of following ten months.
- g--Terms: \$35.00 per month. ~~IN~~ 4 months in advance.
- h--Wall to be redecorated and windows repaired.
