ORDINANCE NO. 185

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE LICENSING OF BOWLING ALLEYS, PIN BALL MACHINES, BILLIARD TABLES, POOL TABLES, OR TABLES KEPT FOR SIMILAR PURPOSES, WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF BRIGHTON, MACOUPIN AND JERSEY COUNTIES, ILLINOIS, AND PROVIDING A PENALTY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF BRIGHTON, MACOUPIN AND JERSEY COUNTIES, ILLINOIS.

Section 1: That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to operate bowling alleys, pin ball machines, billiard tables, pool tables, or tables kept for similar purposes, within the Village of Brighton, Illinois, unless said person, firm or corporation shall first obtain a license, as hereinafter provided.

Section 2: Any person, firm or corporation desiring a license to operate bowling alleys, pin ball machines, billiard tables, pool tables, or tables kept for similar purposes shall file application with the Village Clerk; the applicant shall also pay to the Village Clerk an annual fee as follows:

- For each Bowling alley.....\$10.00
- For each Pin Ball Machine..... 12.00
- For each Billiard Table, Pool Table, or table kept for similar purposes.... 5.00

All such licenses to expire on the 1st day of May next after their issuance and when application is made after the 1st day of August of any year, the license fee shall be the proportionate part of the annual rate fixed by this Ordinance.

Section 3: Every person, firm or corporation who shall have a license under the provision of this Ordinance to operate bowling alleys, billiard tables, pool tables, or tables kept for similar purposes shall close his place of business not later than 12:00 midnight and shall not re-open the same before 6:00 o'clock A.M., with the exception of Sunday when the opening hour shall be not earlier than 1:00 o'clock P.M.

Section 4: Any person, firm or corporation, violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$100.00 for each offense.

Section 5: All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 186

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE LICENSING OF PEDDLERS AND HAWKERS, WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF BRIGHTON, MACOUPIN AND JERSEY COUNTIES, ILLINOIS, AND PROVIDING A PENALTY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF BRIGHTON, MACOUPIN AND JERSEY COUNTIES, ILLINOIS.

Section 1: It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to engage in the business of hawker or peddler of any merchandise, article, or thing, within the Village of Brighton, Illinois, without having first obtained a license therefor.

Section 2: Application for such licenses shall be made to the Village Clerk, and shall state thereon the number of vehicles, if any, intended to be operated; the kind of article or merchandise to be peddled, and the permanent address of the peddler.

Section 3: The fee for such license shall be: Cart, wagon, automobile or other vehicle \$24.00 for each such vehicle for an annual license; and \$2.00 for each such vehicle for a daily license. For peddlers not using any such vehicle, the fee shall be \$24.00 for an annual license and \$2.00 for each such vehicle for a daily license. Section 4: Any licensed peddler or hawker who shall be ailty of any fraud, cheating, or misrepresentation, whether through himself or through an employee, while acting as a peddler in the municipality, or who shall barter, sell or peddle any goods, wares or merchandise other than those specified in his application for a license shall be fined not less than \$5.00 or more than \$200.00 for each such offense and the President and Board of Trustees may revoke his license for such offense.

Section 5: Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$200.00 for each offense; and a separate offense shall be deemed committed on each day during or on which a violation occurs or continues.

Section 6: All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of the ordinance are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, approval, and publication as provided by law.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, there is in use in the Village of Brighton, Macoupin County, Illinois, an existing roadway which is located on the West side of the Gulf, Mobile and Ohio Railroad right-of-way, and which runs in a Southerly direction from a point where the South line of Myrtle Street extended East intersects said roadway to a point where said roadway enters State Route No. 111, and

WHEREAS, the Gulf, Mobile and Ohio Railroad is desirous of closing that portion of said roadway and leasing or selling the said territory to the Hansen Constructing Company of Alton, Illinois, and the said Hansen Constructing Company is desirous of leasing or purchasing this territory from the said Railroad and further desires that this roadway be closed: and

WHEREAS, said roadway is on the right-of-way of said Railroad and has never been platted as a street by the Village of Brighton, Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Brighton, Illinois, feel that the Village will be saved a considerable expense in not being required to maintain this roadway; and

Q WHEREAS, the citizens of the Village of Brighton, Illinois, will not be unduly inconvenienced by the closing of this portion of the roadway; and

WHEREAS, it will be advantageous to the Village of Brighton, Illinois, to have the Hansen Constructing Company construct and maintain warehouses and other buildings in said Village on the said strip of ground;

Now Therefore, be it Resolved that the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Brighton, Illinois, go on record as being in favor of closing that portion of the existing roadway which lies on the West side of the Gulf, Mobile and Ohio Railroad right-of-way, between a point where the South line of Myrtle Street extended East intersects said roadway and the point where said roadway intersects ~~with~~ with State Route No. 111. Be it further resolved that this Resolution is passed inducing the said Railroad to lease or sell this strip of ground to the Hansen Constructing Company of Alton, Illinois, so it may utilize it for construction purposes.
