ORDINANCE NO. 188

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE LEVY AND ASSESSMENT OF TAXES FOR THE VILLAGE OF BRIGHTON, ILLINOIS, FOR THE CURRENT FISCAL YEAR FROM THE 1st. DAY OF MAY, A. D. 1948 TO THE 1st. DAY OF MAY, A. D. 1949.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF BRIGHTON, ILLINOIS: -

Section 1. That the sum of Three Thousand Nine Hundred Fifty and no/100 Dollars (\$3950.00), or so much thereof as may be allowed by law, be and the same is hereby levied and assessed on all of the real and personal property within the said Village subject to taxation, according to the valuation of said property as the same is assessed for State and County purposes for the current fiscal year, and appropriation having been heretofore made for all corporation purposes of said Village. The items of said appropriation and the apportionment of the amount levied appear in the columns below, as follows:
