NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF BRIGHTON, ILLINOIS:

1. That there be submitted to the voters of the Village of Brighton, Illinois, on separate ballot, at the election to be held in said Village on Tuesday, April 19, 1949, the following proposition:

" Shall Daylight Saving Time, being one hour in advance of Central Standard Time, be established in the Village of Brighton, Illinois, each year from 2:00 O'clock A. M. of the last Sunday in the month of April and until 2:00 O'clock A. M. of the last Sunday in the following September?"

2. That the Village Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to cause to be prepared and delivered to the officials conducting said election separate ballots to be used in voting for or against the above proposition.

ORDINANCE NO. 192

WHEREAS, there was submitted to the voters of the Village of Brighton, Macoupin and Jersey Counties, Illinois, at the election held on the 19th day of April, 1949, the following proposition:

"Shall Daylight Saving Time, being one hour in advance of Central Standard Time, be established in the Village of Brighton, Illinois, each year from 2:00 O'clock A.M. on the last Sunday in the month of April and until 2:00 O'clock A.M. on the last Sunday in the following September?";

and

WHEREAS, at said election a majority of the voters of said Village voted in favor of the proposition, 259 voters having voted "Yes" in favor of the proposition, and 209 voters having voted "No" against the same, and there were 7 ballots defectively marked and not counted.

NOW THEREFORE, Be it ordained by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Brighton, Macoupin and Jersey Counties, Illinois:

Section 1: That Daylight Savings Time, being one hour in advance of Central Standard Time, is hereby established in the Village of Brighton, Illinois, each year from 2:00 O'clock A.M. on the last Sunday in the month of April and until 2:00 O'clock A.M. on the last Sunday in the following September.

Section 2: This Ordinance shall be in effect upon its passage and approval as required by law.
