Upon a motion by Anders and seconded by Oertel the appointments to the Water Board were accepted.

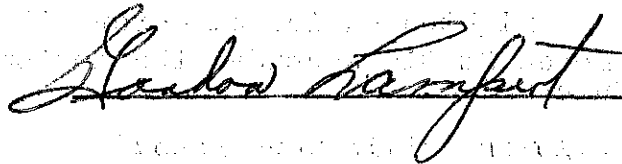
