Scheffel moved St Cin seconded the motion that the Village of Brighton follow the procedure taken by the City of Alton in regard to the extension of daylight savings time.

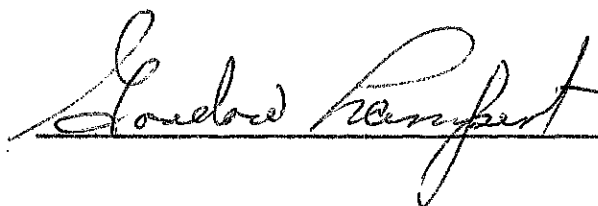
