B. 1959 SHALL BE \$800.00, WHICH SHALL AUTHORIZE THE RETAIL SALES ONLY OF ALCOHOLIC LIQUORS ON THE PREMISES DESCRIBED IN THE APPLICATION AND THE LICENSE. ALL FEES SHALL BE PAID QUARTERLY IN ADVANCE, AND IN THE EVENT OF REVOCATION OR DENIAL OF THE LICENSE, THE PRO*RATA SHARE THEREOF SHALL BE RETURNED, ALL FEES SHALL BE PAID PROMPTLY TO THE VILLAGE TREASURER.

IT IS FURTHER PROVIDED HEREIN THAT THE NUMBER OF TAVERNS OR PLACES WHERE ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR CAN BE SOLD WETHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE VILLAGE SHALL BE LIMITED TO TWO. ROLL CALL VOTE:
