Trustee State Remarks Now is the time to increase our Saloon license. I was in hopes the Mayor would take some steps in the matter. He having failed to do so, I look it upon myself to have the clerk prepare one (hand ordinance to Clerk requesting it to be read) Ordinance read aloud. Whereupon trustee State asks each individual trustee for an expression of opinion as to the license rate of \$900.00. All trustees approved the amount Pres. Jones suggests. "We used to get \$1800.00 from 3 of them; State states - the sum of \$900.00 appearing satisfactory I now introduce ordinance No. 13 on its passage. As read as follows " Ordinance No. 13

An Ordinance to amend a (revised) Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance regulating the licensing Sale of Intoxicating, malt, Vinous, mixed fermented liquors (in the Village of Brighton) passed July 6, 1886. Approved July 6, 1886. This Ordinance shall be in force the 2d day of August 1886. Section One. Be it ordained by the president & Board of trustees of the Village of Brighton: That Section 2 of Revised Ordinance No XXI, entitled - "An ordinance regulating the licensing Sale of Intoxicating, malt, Vinous mixed fermented liquors (in the Village of Brighton) passed July 6, 1886 Approved July 6, 1886, be amended to read as follows. Section 2. License to keep a dram shop & to sell the liquors enumerated in Section 1 of this ordinance, in said Village, may be granted for any period not extending beyond the current Municipal year upon the following conditions, viz: The person or persons desiring such license shall make application therefor in writing, setting forth the time for which the same is desired & the location of the building or room to be occupied for that purpose, shall pay into the Village treasury such sums as shall be at the rate of nine hundred dollars per year for the time desired & shall in addition to the bond required by the laws of the State of Illinois enter into a further bond, with securities to be approved by the Board in the penal sum of five hundred dollars, payable to said Village of Brighton, conditioned that the applicant will conduct said business in accordance with law & the ordinances of the Village, that he will not permit any person to conduct or gambeling of any species in the house, room or place where such liquors are sold, or in any room or place adjacent thereto & under his control that he will not see, barter give or deliver, or cause or permit the same to be done any intoxicating, malt, Vinous, mixed or fermented liquor or liquors of any kind to any minor, or idiotic or distracted or intoxicated person, or to any habitual drunkard. Such application, the said required bonds & the Treasurers Certificate of the amount paid in shall be submitted to the Board of trustees in open meeting, objections to granting such license may at the same time be heard. If the Board shall approve said bonds & decide to grant such application, an order or resolution shall be passed to that effect entered upon the record, & the clerk shall issue such license to said applicant. Provided said Board shall have the right to reject or refuse to grant all applications, or any particular application for such license, if in its opinion the interests of the Village will be best promoted thereby, or that the place where said applicant desires to sell such liquors is unsuitable for that
